## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the transition of case management for children and

- 3 pregnant women program services and Healthy Texas Women program
- 4 services to a managed care program.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 533, Government Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 533.002555 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 533.002555. TRANSITION OF CASE MANAGEMENT FOR CHILDREN
- 9 AND PREGNANT WOMEN PROGRAM RECIPIENTS TO MANAGED CARE PROGRAM. (a)
- 10 In this section, "children and pregnant women program" means the
- 11 benefits program provided under Medicaid and administered by the
- 12 Department of State Health Services that provides case management
- 13 <u>services to children who have a health condition or health risk and</u>
- 14 pregnant women who have a high-risk condition.
- 15 (b) The commission shall transition to a Medicaid managed
- 16 care model for case management services provided to recipients
- 17 under the children and pregnant women program. In transitioning
- 18 services under this section, the commission shall ensure a
- 19 recipient is provided case management services through the managed
- 20 care plan in which the recipient is enrolled.
- 21 (c) In implementing this section, the commission shall
- 22 <u>ensure:</u>

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- 23 (1) a seamless transition in case management for
- 24 recipients receiving benefits under the children and pregnant women

- 1 program; and
- 2 (2) case management services provided under the
- 3 program are not interrupted.
- 4 SECTION 2. Subchapter F, Chapter 32, Health and Safety
- 5 Code, is amended by amending Section 32.152 and adding Sections
- 6 32.156 and 32.157 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 32.152. [ASSESSING] PROVISION OF HEALTHY TEXAS WOMEN
- 8 PROGRAM SERVICES THROUGH MANAGED CARE. (a) The commission shall
- 9 contract [assess:
- 10 [(1) the feasibility and cost-effectiveness of
- 11 contracting] with Medicaid managed care organizations to provide
- 12 Healthy Texas Women program services [through managed care in one
- 13 or more health care service regions in this state if the Healthy
- 14 Texas Women Section 1115 Demonstration Waiver is approved; and
- 15 [(2) the potential impact of that delivery model on
- 16 women receiving services under the program].
- 17 (b) In implementing this section, the commission shall:
- 18 <u>(1) consult with the state Medicaid managed care</u>
- 19 advisory committee before contracting with Medicaid managed care
- 20 organizations to provide Healthy Texas Women program services under
- 21 this section;
- 22 (2) identify barriers that prevent women from
- 23 obtaining Healthy Texas Women program services and seek
- 24 opportunities to mitigate those barriers; and
- 25 <u>(3) designate Healthy Texas Women program service</u>
- 26 providers as significant traditional providers until at least the
- 27 third anniversary of the date the commission initially contracts

- 1 with Medicaid managed care organizations to provide program
- 2 services. [This section expires September 1, 2021.]
- 3 Sec. 32.156. INFORMATION ABOUT AVAILABILITY OF SUBSIDIZED
- 4 HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE. (a) The commission and each managed
- 5 care organization participating in the Healthy Texas Women program
- 6 shall provide a written notice containing information about
- 7 eligibility requirements for and enrollment in a health benefit
- 8 plan for which an enrollee receives a premium subsidy under the
- 9 Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (Pub. L. No. 111-148),
- 10 based on family income, to a woman who:
- 11 (1) is enrolled in the Healthy Texas Women program;
- 12 and
- 13 (2) has a household income that is more than 100
- 14 percent but not more than 200 percent of the federal poverty level.
- 15 (b) The commission, in consultation with the Texas
- 16 Department of Insurance, shall develop the form and content of the
- 17 notice required under this section. The notice must include:
- 18 (1) the latest information written in clear and easily
- 19 understood language on available options for obtaining a subsidized
- 20 health benefit plan described by Subsection (a); and
- 21 (2) resources for receiving assistance applying for
- 22 and enrolling in that health benefit plan.
- Sec. 32.157. ASSESSING AUTOMATIC ENROLLMENT OF CERTAIN
- 24 WOMEN IN MANAGED CARE. (a) Not later than January 1, 2023, the
- 25 <u>commission shall assess the feasibility, cost-effectiveness, and</u>
- 26 benefits of automatically enrolling in managed care the women who
- 27 become pregnant while receiving services through the Healthy Texas

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- 1 Women program. The assessment must examine whether automatically
- 2 enrolling those women leads to the delivery of prenatal care and
- 3 services earlier in the women's pregnancies.
- 4 (b) This section expires September 1, 2023.
- 5 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 6 of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 7 Services Commission shall adopt rules necessary to implement the
- 8 changes in law made by this Act.
- 9 SECTION 4. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 10 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 11 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 12 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 13 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 14 waiver or authorization is granted.
- 15 SECTION 5. The Health and Human Services Commission is
- 16 required to implement a provision of this Act only if the
- 17 legislature appropriates money specifically for that purpose. If
- 18 the legislature does not appropriate money specifically for that
- 19 purpose, the Health and Human Services Commission may, but is not
- 20 required to, implement a provision of this Act using other
- 21 appropriations available for that purpose.
- 22 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
