2	relating to background and criminal history checks for operators
3	and employees of certain child-care facilities.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 42.159, Human Resources Code, is amended
6	by adding Subsections $(b-1)$ , $(b-2)$ , and $(c-1)$ to read as follows:
7	(b-1) A person subject to the background and criminal
8	history check required by Subsection (a) or (b) shall submit to the
9	commission a complete set of fingerprints.
10	(b-2) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules to
11	implement this section. The rules adopted under this section:
12	(1) must require that the fingerprints submitted be in
13	a form and of a quality acceptable to the Department of Public
14	Safety and the Federal Bureau of Investigation for the purpose of
15	conducting a criminal history check;
16	(2) may require that the fingerprints be submitted
17	electronically through an applicant fingerprinting service center;
18	and
19	(3) may allow the commission to waive a fingerprint
20	submission required by this section if:
21	(A) the person for whom the submission is
22	required has:
23	(i) a fingerprint-based criminal history
24	check on file with the commission; or

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1	(ii) a fingerprint-based criminal history
2	clearinghouse record, as provided by Section 411.0845, Government
3	Code, that is accessible to the commission through the Department
4	of Public Safety; and
5	(B) the commission has an active subscription to
6	the Federal Bureau of Investigation's National Record of Arrest and
7	Prosecution Back Service for the person for whom the fingerprint
8	submission is required.
9	(c-1) For each person whose fingerprints are submitted
10	under Subsection (b-1), the department shall conduct a state and
11	Federal Bureau of Investigation criminal history check by:
12	(1) submitting the person's fingerprints, or causing
13	the fingerprints to be submitted electronically, to the Department
14	of Public Safety for the purpose of conducting a state and federal
15	criminal history check; and
16	(2) using the resulting information made available by
17	that department under Section 411.114, Government Code, and by the
18	Federal Bureau of Investigation and any other criminal justice
19	agency under Section 411.087, Government Code.
20	SECTION 2. Section 42.206, Human Resources Code, is amended
21	by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsections (b-1) and (c-1)
22	to read as follows:
23	(b) In addition to the requirements of Subsection (a), a
24	shelter shall submit a complete set of fingerprints of each person
25	required to undergo a criminal history check under Subsection (a)
26	[ <del>if:</del>
27	[(1) the person has lived outside the state at any time

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1	during the previous five years; or
2	[ <del>(2) the shelter has reason to suspect that the person</del>
3	has a criminal history in another state].
4	(b-1) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules to
5	implement this section. The rules adopted under this section:
6	(1) must require that the fingerprints submitted be in
7	a form and of a quality acceptable to the Department of Public
8	Safety and the Federal Bureau of Investigation for purposes of
9	conducting a criminal history check;
10	(2) may require that the fingerprints be submitted
11	electronically through an applicant fingerprinting service center;
12	and
13	(3) may allow the commission to waive a fingerprint
14	submission required by this section if:
15	(A) the person for whom the submission is
16	required has:
17	(i) a fingerprint-based criminal history
18	check on file with the commission; or
19	(ii) a fingerprint-based criminal history
20	clearinghouse record, as provided by Section 411.0845, Government
21	Code, that is accessible to the commission through the Department

24	the Federal Bureau of Investigation's National Record of Arrest and

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1	under Subsection (b), the department shall conduct a state and
2	Federal Bureau of Investigation criminal history check by:
3	(1) submitting the person's fingerprints, or causing

5	of Public Safety for the purpose of conducting a state and federal
6	criminal history check; and
7	(2) using the resulting information made available by
8	that department under Section 411.114, Government Code, and by the
9	Federal Bureau of Investigation and any other criminal justice
10	agency under Section 411.087, Government Code.
11	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
