2	relating to state agency information technology and data services
3	modernization plans.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. (a) Not later than October 1, 2022, each state
6	agency in the executive and legislative branches of state
7	government, using money appropriated to the agency by this state,
8	shall prepare a 5-year agencywide plan outlining the manner in
9	which the agency intends to transition its information technology
10	and data-related services and capabilities into a more modern,
11	integrated, secure, and effective technological environment.
12	(b) The plan must:
13	(1) describe the agency's project management
14	processes;
15	(2) identify the resources required to implement the
16	plan;
17	(3) define the desired outcomes of the plan;

- 18 (4) quantify current and planned investments in cloud
- 19 applications and infrastructure;
- 20 (5) include:
- 21 (A) legacy system modernization or replacement;
- 22 (B) modernization achievements and capabilities
- 23 offered through the Department of Information resources data center
- 24 services program;

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- 1 (C) an evaluation of the fully integrated
- 2 commercial applications service options available to the agency to
- 3 meet modernization needs;
- 4 (D) a description of plans to integrate cloud
- 5 application and infrastructure services into the overall
- 6 architecture of the agency;
- 7 (E) an analysis of the technical and data
- 8 architecture necessary for the agency to provide enhanced data
- 9 analytics, reporting, and performance management; and
- 10 (F) identify efforts to improve the citizen
- 11 interaction, process efficiencies, and agency operations through
- 12 modernization; and
- 13 (5) describe the agency's approach to creating an
- 14 automated, interoperable, agencywide data analytics and
- 15 performance management system that transforms data into meaningful
- 16 information to support data-driven decision making, quality
- 17 improvement initiatives, efficient service delivery, and effective
- 18 regulation and oversight of programs administered by the agency.
- 19 (c) Each state agency shall coordinate with the Department
- 20 of Information Resources to implement this section.
- 21 (d) Each agency shall submit the plan to the:
- 22 (1) governor;
- 23 (2) lieutenant governor;
- 24 (3) speaker of the house of representatives;
- 25 (4) Department of Information Resources;
- 26 (5) Sunset Advisory Commission; and
- 27 (6) standing committees of the senate and house of

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- 1 representatives with primary jurisdiction over state agency
- 2 information technology.
- 3 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
