4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 241, Health and Safety
6	Code, is amended by adding Section 241.012 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 241.012. IN-PERSON VISITATION OF RELIGIOUS COUNSEL.
8	(a) In this section, "religious counsel" means an individual
9	acting substantially in a pastoral or religious capacity to counsel
10	other individuals.
11	(b) A hospital may not prohibit in-person visitation of
12	religious counsel with a patient at the hospital who is seriously
13	<u>ill or dying.</u>
14	(c) Notwithstanding Subsection (b), a hospital may require
15	religious counsel to:
16	(1) submit to a health screening administered by the
17	hospital; and
18	(2) wear personal protective equipment at all times
19	while visiting a patient at the hospital.
20	(d) In the event of a conflict between this section and any
21	other law, this section prevails.
22	SECTION 2. Subchapter L, Chapter $242$ , Health and Safety
23	Code, is amended by adding Section 242.506 to read as follows:
24	Sec. 242.506. IN-PERSON VISITATION OF RELIGIOUS COUNSEL.

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(a) In this section, "religious counsel" means an individual 1 2 acting substantially in a pastoral or religious capacity to counsel other individuals. 3 4 (b) A facility may not prohibit in-person visitation of 5 religious counsel with a resident of the facility who is seriously 6 ill or dying. 7 (c) Notwithstanding Subsection (b), a facility may require 8 religious counsel to: 9 (1) submit to a health screening administered by the 10 facility; and (2) wear personal protective equipment at all times 11 12 while visiting a resident at the facility. (d) In the event of a conflict between this section and any 13 14 other law, this section prevails. 15 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2021. 19

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
