4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter G, Chapter 130, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 130.1305 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 130.1305. TEXAS COMMISSION ON COMMUNITY COLLEGE
8	FINANCE. (a) The Texas Commission on Community College Finance is
9	established to make recommendations for consideration by the 88th
10	Texas Legislature regarding the state funding formula and funding
11	levels for public junior colleges in Texas that would be sufficient
12	to sustain viable junior college education and training offerings
13	throughout the state and improve student outcomes in alignment with
14	state postsecondary goals.
15	(b) The commission is composed of 12 members as follows:
16	(1) four members appointed by the governor;
17	(2) three members appointed by the lieutenant
18	governor;
19	(3) three members appointed by the speaker of the
20	house of representatives;
21	(4) one member appointed by the board of the Texas
22	Association of Community Colleges; and
23	(5) one member appointed by the board of the Community
24	College Association of Texas Trustees.

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1 (c) One of the members appointed by the governor must be a 2 faculty member at a public junior college as defined by Section 61.003, and the other members appointed by the governor must be 3 representatives of junior college leaders, business leaders, or 4 other stakeholders knowledgeable in junior college mission, 5 instructional programs, and finance. 6 7 (d) Members appointed by the lieutenant governor shall consist of: 8 9 (1) two members of the senate; and 10 (2) one individual who is an administrator of a public junior college as defined by Section 61.003, a business leader, or a 11 stakeholder knowledgeable in junior college mission, instructional 12 13 programs, and finance. (e) Members appointed by the speaker of the house of 14 15 representatives shall consist of: 16 (1) two members of the house of representatives; and 17 (2) an administrator from a public junior college as defined by Section 61.003. 18 In making appointments, the governor, lieutenant 19 (f) 20 governor, and speaker of the house of representatives shall coordinate to ensure that the membership of the commission 21 reflects, to the extent possible, the geographic diversity of Texas 22 public junior colleges and the ethnic diversity of the communities 23 24 served by those junior colleges. 25 (g) The commission shall convene not later than October 15, 26 2021, and shall continue its activities until completion of a final 27 report.

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1 (h) The commission shall examine trend and forecast data, 2 seek stakeholder input, and account for equity in student outcomes 3 and based on its findings, make recommendations on: 4 (1) the components of state funding for public junior colleges, including contact hour funding formulas established for 5 public junior colleges under Subchapter C, Chapter 61, and 6 7 Subchapter A of this chapter; and (2) the feasibility of establishing shared service 8 agreements or interinstitutional collaborations through which 9 institutions of higher education may perform administrative 10 services, other than direct instruction and student support 11 services, for other institutions of higher education for a fee or 12 13 other consideration. 14 (i) To inform the recommendations required under Subsection (h), the commission may examine and make recommendations on other 15 policy and finance matters, including: 16 17 (1) workforce demand and skills gaps; 18 (2) dual credit programs and costs; (3) variation between taxing districts and service 19 20 areas; (4) student graduation, transfer, and success 21 metrics; and 22 23 (5) the relationship between economic cycles and student enrollment. 24 25 (j) The commission may seek resource support, including data analyses and technical assistance, from the Texas Higher 26 27 Education Coordinating Board, the Texas Association of Community

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1	Colleges, and research organizations. The commission may accept
2	gifts, grants, and donations from any source to be used to carry out
3	a function of the commission.
4	(k) The governor shall designate the presiding officer of
5	the commission.
6	(1) The commission shall submit a final report and
7	recommendations to the governor, lieutenant governor, and both
8	houses of the legislature not later than November 1, 2022.
9	(m) This section expires January 1, 2023.
