A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to the feasibility of creating and maintaining a coastal 1-19 barrier system. 1-20 1-21

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. (a) The legislature shall establish a joint interim committee to continue to study the implementation of a coastal barrier system in this state that includes a series of gates 1-22 1-23 1-24 1-25 and barriers to prevent storm surge damage to gulf beaches or 1-26 coastal ports, industry, or property. (b)

The committee is composed of:

1-27 1-28 (1) the members of the standing committee of the senate that has primary jurisdiction over natural resources; 1-29

1-30 (2) the members of the standing committee of the house 1-31 of representatives that has primary jurisdiction over land and 1-32 resource management;

1-33 members of the senate (3) two appointed by the 1-34 lieutenant governor, each of whom represents a district in a county 1-35 that borders the Gulf of Mexico; and

1-36 (4) two members of the house of representatives appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives, each of whom represents a district in a county that borders the Gulf of 1-37 1-38 1-39 Mexico.

The lieutenant governor and the speaker of the house of 1-40 (c) 1-41 representatives shall jointly designate a chair or, alternatively, 1-42 designate two co-chairs from among the committee membership.

The committee may adopt rules necessary to carry out the 1-43 (d) 1-44 committee's duties under this section.

1-45 (e) Not later than December 1, 2022, the committee shall report to the governor and the legislature the findings of the study 1-46 and any recommendations developed by the committee under this 1-47 1-48 section.

1-49 The committee is abolished and this Act expires January (f) 1-50 9, 2023.

1-51 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 1-52 1-53 1-54 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 1-55 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.

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
