## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to an employment termination report and other records submitted to the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement by a law 3 enforcement agency. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 1701.451(c), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 7 (c) If the commission receives from a law enforcement agency 8 a request that complies with Subsections (a)(1) and (b), the 9 commission [employee having the responsibility to maintain any 10 employment termination report regarding the person who is the 11 12 subject of the request] shall release the report to the agency. SECTION 2. Sections 1701.452(a), (b), (d), and (g), 13 14 Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows: (a) The head of a law enforcement agency or the head's 15 designee shall submit a report to the commission on a form 16 17 prescribed by the commission regarding a person licensed under this chapter [who resigns or retires from employment with the law 18 enforcement agency, whose appointment with the law enforcement 19 20 agency is terminated, or] who separates from the law enforcement 21 agency for any [other] reason. The report must be submitted by the 22 head or the designee not later than the seventh business day after the date the license holder: 23 [resigns, retires, is terminated, or] separates 24 (1)

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1 from the agency; and

2 (2) exhausts all administrative appeals available to3 the license holder, if applicable.

4 The head of a law enforcement agency or the head's (b) designee shall indicate [include] in the report required under 5 Subsection (a) [a statement on] whether the license holder was 6 suspected of misconduct, regardless of whether the license holder 7 was terminated for misconduct [honorably discharged, generally 8 discharged, or dishonorably discharged and, as required by the 9 10 commission, an explanation of the circumstances under which the person resigned, retired, or was terminated]. For purposes of this 11 subsection, "misconduct" includes a license holder engaging in 12 criminal conduct, regardless of whether the license holder was 13 arrested for, charged with, or convicted of an offense [+ 14

15 [(1) "Honorably discharged" means a license holder 16 who, while in good standing and not because of pending or final 17 disciplinary actions or a documented performance problem, retired, 18 resigned, or separated from employment with or died while employed 19 by a law enforcement agency.

20 [(2) "Generally discharged" means a license holder
21 who:

[(A) was terminated by, retired or resigned from, or died while in the employ of a law enforcement agency and the separation was related to a disciplinary investigation of conduct that is not included in the definition of dishonorably discharged; or
[(B) was terminated by or retired or resigned

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1	from a law enforcement agency and the separation was for a
2	documented performance problem and was not because of a reduction
3	in workforce or an at-will employment decision.
4	[ <del>(3) "Dishonorably discharged" means a license holder</del>
5	who:
6	[ <del>(A) was terminated by a law enforcement agency</del>
7	or retired or resigned in lieu of termination by the agency in
8	relation to allegations of criminal misconduct; or
9	[ <del>(B) was terminated by a law enforcement agency</del>
10	or retired or resigned in lieu of termination by the agency for
11	insubordination or untruthfulness].
12	(d) The head of the law enforcement agency from which a
13	license holder [ <del>resigns, retires, is terminated, or</del> ] separates for
14	reasons other than death, or the head's designee, shall provide to
15	the license holder a copy of the report. The report must be provided
16	to the license holder not later than the seventh business day after
17	the date the license holder:
18	(1) [ <del>resigns, retires, is terminated, or</del> ] separates
19	from the agency; and
20	(2) exhausts all administrative appeals available to
21	the license holder, if applicable.
22	(g) The head of a law enforcement agency or the head's
23	designee must submit a report under this section each time a person
24	licensed under this chapter [resigns, retires, is terminated, or]
25	separates for any [ <del>other</del> ] reason from the agency. The report is an
26	official government document.
27	SECTION 3. Sections 1701.4525(a), (d), and (e), Occupations

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1 Code, are amended to read as follows:

2 A person who is the subject of an employment termination (a) 3 report maintained by the commission under this subchapter may contest an indication under Section 1701.452(b) that the person was 4 suspected of misconduct [information] contained in the report by 5 submitting to the law enforcement agency and to the commission a 6 written petition on a form prescribed by the commission for a 7 8 correction of the report not later than the 30th day after the date the person receives a copy of the report. On receipt of the 9 petition, the commission shall refer the petition to the State 10 Office of Administrative Hearings. 11

12 (d) A proceeding to contest <u>an indication of misconduct</u> 13 [<u>information</u>] in an employment termination report is a contested 14 case under Chapter 2001, Government Code.

15 In a proceeding to contest an indication of misconduct (e) 16 [information] in an employment termination report [for a report 17 based on alleged misconduct], an administrative law judge shall determine if the alleged misconduct occurred by a preponderance of 18 19 the evidence regardless of whether the person who is the subject of the report was terminated for the misconduct [or the person 20 21 resigned, retired, or separated in lieu of termination]. If the alleged misconduct is not supported by a preponderance of the 22 23 evidence, the administrative law judge shall order the commission 24 to change the report. The commission shall send the changed report to the law enforcement agency that prepared the original employment 25 26 termination report. The law enforcement agency shall replace the original employment termination report with the changed report. 27

S.B. No. 1268 SECTION 4. The following provisions of the Occupations Code are repealed:

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- (1) Section 1701.452(c);
- 4 (2) Section 1701.4521; and
- 5 (3) Section 1701.454.

6 SECTION 5. Not later than December 1, 2021, the Texas 7 Commission on Law Enforcement shall update the form for an 8 employment termination report as necessary to comply with Section 9 1701.452, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act.

10 SECTION 6. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 11 a report required to be submitted under Section 1701.452, 12 Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, regarding a separation of 13 a license holder that occurs on or after December 1, 2021. A 14 separation that occurs before December 1, 2021, is governed by the 15 law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and 16 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

17 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
