## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## 1 AN ACT relating to the participation by members of nonprofit teacher 2 organizations in a tutoring program for public school students and 3 4 related retirement benefits for certain tutors participating in the 5 program. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 7 SECTION 1. Section 22.092(d), Education Code, is amended to read as follows: 8 (d) The agency shall provide [private schools and public 9 schools] equivalent access to the registry maintained under this 10 section to: 11 12 (1) private schools; 13 (2) public schools; and (3) nonprofit teacher organizations approved by the 14 15 commissioner for the purpose of participating in the tutoring program established under Section 33.913. 16 17 SECTION 2. Subchapter Z, Chapter 33, Education Code, is amended by adding Section 33.913 to read as follows: 18 Sec. 33.913. TUTORING PROGRAM. (a) A member of a nonprofit 19 20 teacher organization may participate in a tutoring program in accordance with this section to provide supplemental instruction to 21 22 students in kindergarten through grade 12 on an individualized or small-group basis. 23 (b) To participate in the program as a tutor, a person must: 24

1	(1) be an active or retired teacher;
2	(2) apply for the position in a manner specified by the
3	nonprofit organization;
4	(3) designate in the application whether the person
5	plans to provide tutoring:
6	(A) for compensation, on a volunteer basis, or
7	both; and
8	(B) in-person, online, or both; and
9	(4) not be included in the registry of persons not
10	eligible for employment by a public school under Section 22.092.
11	(c) Each school district superintendent or the person
12	designated by the superintendent shall oversee the tutoring program
13	within the district.
14	(d) A school district may use any available state or federal
15	funds to provide compensation to a person participating in the
16	program as a tutor who is providing tutoring for compensation under
17	the program.
18	(e) If an active or retired teacher who has been approved
19	for participation in the tutoring program contacts a school
20	district to provide tutoring to students in the district, the
21	district shall:
22	(1) if the teacher is providing tutoring services on a
23	volunteer basis, use the volunteer tutoring services provided by
24	the teacher; or
25	(2) if the district has state or federal funds for
26	purposes of the tutoring program and the teacher is providing
27	tutoring services for compensation, employ the teacher as a tutor.

1	(f) At least quarterly, each nonprofit organization
2	participating in the tutoring program shall provide to the
3	organization's members:
4	(1) a description of the tutoring program and guidance
5	on how to participate in the program; and
6	(2) the contact information of each person described
7	by Subsection (c) for the school district in which the member
8	resides and any adjacent districts.
9	SECTION 3. Section 824.602(a), Government Code, is amended
10	to read as follows:
11	(a) Subject to Section 825.506, the retirement system may
12	not, under Section 824.601, withhold a monthly benefit payment if
13	the retiree is employed in a Texas public educational institution:
14	(1) as a substitute only with pay not more than the
15	daily rate of substitute pay established by the employer and, if the
16	retiree is a disability retiree, the employment has not exceeded a
17	total of 90 days in the school year;
18	(2) in a position, other than as a substitute, on no
19	more than a one-half time basis for the month;
20	(3) in one or more positions on as much as a full-time
21	basis, if the retiree has been separated from service with all Texas
22	public educational institutions for at least 12 full consecutive
23	months after the retiree's effective date of retirement; [ <del>or</del> ]
24	(4) in a position, other than as a substitute, on no
25	more than a one-half time basis for no more than 90 days in the
26	school year, if the retiree is a disability retiree; or
27	(5) as a tutor under Section 33.913, Education Code.

SECTION 4. Subchapter G, Chapter 825, Government Code, is
amended by adding Section 825.604 to read as follows:

3 <u>Sec. 825.604. INFORMATION PROVIDED TO MEMBERS. The</u> 4 <u>retirement system shall regularly provide information in an</u> 5 <u>electronic format to members and retirees regarding the tutoring</u> 6 <u>program established under Section 33.913, Education Code, that</u> 7 <u>includes:</u>

8 <u>(1) general information regarding the tutoring</u> 9 program; and

10 (2) a statement directing members and retirees who 11 want to participate in the tutoring program to contact their local 12 school districts for further guidance.

SECTION 5. (a) Subject to Subsection (b) of this section, the changes in law made by this Act apply to a retiree of the Teacher Retirement System of Texas regardless of whether the person retired from employment before, on, or after the effective date of this Act. (b) Section 824.602(a), Government Code, as amended by this

18 Act, applies only to the employment of a retiree of the Teacher 19 Retirement System of Texas that occurs on or after the effective 20 date of this Act.

21 SECTION 6. This Act applies beginning with the 2021-2022 22 school year.

23 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
