- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 614, Government Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subchapter A-1 to read as follows:

## 7 SUBCHAPTER A-1. MENTAL HEALTH LEAVE

- 8 Sec. 614.015. MENTAL HEALTH LEAVE FOR PEACE OFFICERS. (a)
- 9 In this section, "law enforcement agency" means an agency of the
- 10 state or an agency of a political subdivision of the state
- 11 authorized by law to employ peace officers.
- 12 (b) Each law enforcement agency shall develop and adopt a
- 13 policy allowing the use of mental health leave by the peace officers
- 14 employed by the agency who experience a traumatic event in the scope
- 15 of that employment.
- 16 (c) The mental health leave policy adopted under this
- 17 section must:
- 18 (1) provide clear and objective guidelines
- 19 establishing the circumstances under which a peace officer is
- 20 granted mental health leave and may use mental health leave;
- 21 (2) entitle a peace officer to mental health leave
- 22 without a deduction in salary or other compensation;
- 23 (3) enumerate the number of mental health leave days
- 24 available to a peace officer; and

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- 1 (4) detail the level of anonymity for a peace officer
- 2 who takes mental health leave.
- 3 (d) The mental health leave policy adopted under this
- 4 section may provide a list of mental health services available to
- 5 peace officers in the area of the law enforcement agency.
- 6 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 7 of this Act, each law enforcement agency shall develop the mental
- 8 health leave policy required by Section 614.015, Government Code,
- 9 as added by this Act.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
