A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the Texas Real Estate Research Center and the Texas Real 3 Estate Commission. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 86.51, Education Code, is amended to 5 read as follows: 6 7 Sec. 86.51. <u>TEXAS</u> REAL ESTATE RESEARCH CENTER. The Texas Real Estate Research Center, [There] is established at Texas A&M 8 University [a Real Estate Research Center], hereinafter referred to 9 as the center. The operating budget, staffing, and activities of 10 the center shall be approved by the board of regents of The Texas 11 12 A&M University System. SECTION 2. Subsections (c), (d), (e), (f), (h), (i), (j), 13 (k), and (l), Section 86.52, Education Code, are amended to read as 14 follows and subsection (m), Section 86.52, Education Code, is added 15 to read as follows: 16 [Except for the initial appointees, members] Members of 17 (c) the advisory committee hold office for staggered terms of six 18 years, with the terms of three members expiring on January 31 of 19 each odd-numbered year. [In making the initial appointments, the 20 governor shall designate three members, including two 21 representatives of the real estate industry and one representative 22 23 of the general public, for terms expiring in 1973, three for terms expiring in 1975, and three for terms expiring in 1977.] Any vacancy 24

1 shall be filled by appointment for the unexpired portion of the 2 term. Each member shall serve until [his] their successor is 3 qualified.

4 (d) The chairman of the Texas Real Estate Commission, or a
5 member of the commission designated by [him] the chairman, shall
6 serve as an ex officio, nonvoting member of the advisory committee.

7 (e) The <u>advisory</u> committee shall elect a [presiding
8 <u>officer</u>] <u>chairman</u> and [an <u>assistant presiding officer</u>]
9 <u>vice-chairman</u> from its membership, and each [officer] <u>person</u> shall
10 serve for a term of one year.

(f) [The first meeting of the advisory committee shall be called by the president of Texas A & M University or his designated representative.] The <u>advisory</u> committee shall meet not less than semiannually, and in addition on call of its chairman, or on petition of any six of its members, or on call of the president of Texas A & M University or his designated representative.

17 (h) The president of Texas A & M University or [his] their designated representative shall submit to the advisory committee in 18 advance of each fiscal year a proposed budget for expenditures of 19 all funds provided for the center in a form that is related to the 20 proposed schedule of activities for the review and approval of the 21 advisory committee. The proposed budget approved by the advisory 22 23 committee shall be forwarded with the comments of the advisory 24 committee to the board of directors of The Texas A & M University System prior to its action on the proposed budget, and the board of 25 26 directors of The Texas A & M University System shall not authorize any expenditure that has not had the prior approval of the advisory 27

1 committee.

(i) The president of Texas A & M University or [his] their
designated representative shall submit to the advisory committee
for its review and approval a research agenda at the beginning of
each fiscal year and shall continuously inform the advisory
committee of changes in its substance and scheduling.

7 Each member of the [board] advisory committee (j) is 8 entitled to a per diem as set by [legislative appropriation] the advisory committee for each day that the member engages in the 9 business of the [board] advisory committee. A member may not 10 receive any compensation for travel expenses, including expenses 11 12 for meals and lodging, other than transportation expenses. Α member is entitled to compensation for transportation expenses as 13 14 [prescribed] set by the [General Appropriations Act] the advisory 15 committee.

16 (k) Except as provided by subsection (1), [The] the advisory
17 committee is subject to Chapter 551, Government Code, Chapter 2001,
18 Government Code, and the provisions of Chapter 572, Government
19 Code.

(1) <u>The advisory committee may meet by conference call or</u> virtually through third party internet applications as long as members of the general public are able to participate in the meeting and can participate in discussions not subject to an executive session.

25 <u>(m)</u> The financial transactions of the center are subject to 26 audit by the state auditor in accordance with Chapter 321, 27 Government Code.

SECTION 3. Section 1101.054, Occupations Code, is amended
to read as follows:

3 Sec. 1101.054. OFFICIAL OATH. Not later than the 15th 4 <u>calendar</u> day after the date of appointment, each appointee must 5 take the constitutional oath of office.

6 SECTION 4. Subsection (a), Section 1101.154, Occupations 7 Code, is amended to read as follows:

8 Sec. 1101.154. ADDITIONAL FEE: TEXAS REAL ESTATE RESEARCH
9 CENTER. (a) The fee for the issuance or renewal of a:

10 (1) broker license is the amount of the fee set under
11 Section 1101.152 and an additional \$70 <u>annual</u> fee;

12 (2) sales agent license is the amount of the fee set
13 under Section 1101.152 and an additional \$20 <u>annual</u> fee; and

14 (3) certificate of registration is the amount of the
15 fee set under Section 1101.152 and an additional \$20 <u>annual</u> fee.

16 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
