14	depiction reveals in any manner the identity of the person who is
15	the subject of the autopsy, including through:
16	(A) any accompanying or subsequent information
17	or material related to the visual depiction; or
18	(B) information or material provided by a third
19	party in response to the disclosure of the visual depiction.
20	(b) It is an affirmative defense to prosecution under this

22	(1) the disclosure is made in the course of:
23	(A) reporting unlawful activity;
24	(B) a legal proceeding, if the disclosure is

2 (C) a legitimate medical, educational, research, 3 scientific, investigational, forensic, or academic proceeding; or (2) the actor is an interactive computer service, as 4 5 defined by 47 U.S.C. Section 230, and the disclosure consists of an image or visual depiction provided by another person to the 6 7 computer service. 8 (c) An offense under this section is a misdemeanor 9 punishable by: 10 (1) a fine of not more than \$1,000; (2) confinement in the county jail for not more than 11 12 six months; or 13 (3) both the fine and confinement.

(d) If conduct constituting an offense under this section
