8 lead to both a doctor of philosophy degree and a doctor of medicine 9 degree or doctor of osteopathy degree must pass each part of an examination described by Section 155.0511(2), (3), (4), (6), or (7)10 not later than the earlier of the second anniversary of the date the 11 applicant completed all [the] graduate medical training undertaken 12 by the applicant, including internship, residency, and fellowship, 13 or the 12th anniversary of the date the applicant began the graduate 14 medical training [described by Section 155.003(a)(5)].

SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date 16 17 of this Act, the Texas Medical Board shall adopt rules necessary to implement Section 155.051, Occupations Code, as amended by this 18 19 Act.

SECTION 3. Section 155.051, Occupations Code, as amended by 20 this Act, applies to an application for a license to practice 21 medicine issued under Chapter 155, Occupations Code, regardless of 22 whether the application is submitted before, on, or after the 23 24 effective date of this Act.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
