6	SECTION 1. Section 169.001, Occupations Code, is amended by
7	adding Subdivision (7) to read as follows:

9	(A) the Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard,
10	Marine Corps, or Space Force of the United States; or
11	(B) Texas Army National Guard or the Texas Air
12	National Guard.
13	SECTION 2. Section 169.003, Occupations Code, is amended to
14	read as follows:
15	Sec. 169.003. PRESCRIPTION OF LOW-THC CANNABIS. A
16	physician described by Section 169.002 may prescribe low-THC
17	cannabis to a patient if:
18	(1) the patient is a permanent resident of the state;
19	(2) the physician complies with the registration
20	requirements of Section 169.004; and
21	(3) the physician certifies to the department that:
22	(A) the patient is diagnosed with:

24	(ii) a seizure disorder;

No. 1440 (iii) multiple sclerosis; 1 2 (iv) spasticity; 3 (v) amyotrophic lateral sclerosis; 4 (vi) autism; 5 (vii) terminal cancer; [or] 6 (viii) an incurable neurodegenerative 7 disease; or 8 (ix) post-traumatic stress disorder and is 9 <u>a veteran;</u> and (B) the physician determines the risk of the 10 11 medical use of low-THC cannabis by the patient is reasonable in 12 light of the potential benefit for the patient. SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021. 13
