WELL METERING <u>AND PERMITTING EXEMPTIONS</u> [ <u>EXEMPTION</u> ]. SECTION 2. Section 1.33, Chapter 626, Acts of the 73rd Legislature, Regular Session, 1993, is amended by adding Subsections (e), (f), and (g) to read as follows: (e) In addition to permitted withdrawals from the aquifer, a <u>municipally owned utility owned by the City of San Antonio, without</u> <u>a permit, may withdraw groundwater from the aquifer if:</u> (1) the utility uses the groundwater to supply a <u>military installation with water for human consumption,</u> <u>irrigation, operations, mission support, or infrastructure</u> <u>maintenance; and</u> (2) the utility and the military installation enter <u>into a contract requiring the installation to reduce its</u> <u>groundwater withdrawals from the aquifer by the same amount of</u> withdrawn water the installation receives from the utility. (f) Subsection (e) of this section does not alter the <u>obligations of a military installation under a biological opinion</u> <u>issued by a federal agency.</u> (g) The amount of water provided by a municipally owned <u>utility to a military installation under Subsection (e) of this</u> <u>section may not exceed the maximu amount of water that the military installation is authorized to withdraw from the aquifer under a <u>biological opinion issued by a federal agency.</u> SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.</u>
