5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 1579, Insurance Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 1579.1045 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 1579.1045. ALTERNATIVE GROUP HEALTH COVERAGE
9	PROHIBITED. Notwithstanding any other law, a participating entity
10	may not offer or make available to the entity's employees or their
11	dependents group health coverage not provided under the program.
12	SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 1579, Insurance Code, is
13	amended by adding Section 1579.155 to read as follows:
14	Sec. 1579.155. PROGRAM PARTICIPATION: ELECTION. (a)
15	Effective September 1, 2022, a participating entity may elect to
16	discontinue the entity's participation in the program by providing
17	written notice to the trustee not later than December 31 of the year
18	preceding the first day of the plan year in which the election will
19	be effective.
20	(b) A participating entity that elects to discontinue
21	participation in the program under Subsection (a) may not elect to:
22	(1) participate in the program until the fifth
23	anniversary of the effective date of the entity's election to
24	discontinue participation; or

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1 (2) discontinue the entity's participation after an election described by Subdivision (1) until the fifth anniversary 2 of the effective date of that election. 3 (c) Effective September 1, 2022, an entity that elects to 4 participate in the program shall provide written notice to the 5 trustee not later than December 31 of the year preceding the first 6 7 day of the plan year in which the election will be effective. The entity may not elect to discontinue the entity's participation 8 9 until the fifth anniversary of the effective date of the entity's election to participate. 10

11 (d) The trustee by rule shall prescribe the time and manner 12 for making an election under this section and may adopt rules 13 necessary to administer this section.

14 SECTION 3. (a) In this section, "committee" means a 15 regional school district health coverage advisory committee 16 established under this section.

17 (b) Each regional education service center established 18 under Chapter 8, Education Code, shall establish a regional school 19 district health coverage advisory committee to conduct a study 20 assessing:

(1) health care needs of and health coverage options currently available to employees of school districts served by that service center; and

24 (2) alternative health coverage options that may be25 available.

26 (c) The executive director of each regional education27 service center shall serve as the chair of that region's committee.

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The executive director shall appoint nine superintendents of school
districts served by the regional education service center to serve
as members of that region's committee.

4 (d) The study must include, with respect to school districts5 in that committee's region, the following information:

6 (1) an overview of current health coverage plans made 7 available to district employees, including for each plan:

8 (A) the amount paid by districts and by district9 employees for premium under the plan;

10 (B) the schedule of benefits available under the 11 plan; and

12 (C) deductibles and other cost-sharing amounts13 applicable to services provided under the plan;

14 (2) a survey of district employees using a scale that 15 allows the district employee to indicate that the employee is very 16 satisfied, satisfied, somewhat satisfied, somewhat dissatisfied, 17 dissatisfied, or very dissatisfied with:

18 (A) the current costs to the employee of the19 employee's health coverage plan; and

(B) benefits available and access to care underthe employee's plan; and

(3) an assessment of three alternative health coverage options that are available on the open market or through self-funding of school district health care expenses, including for each alternative:

(A) the amount that would be paid by a district
and district employees for premium under the alternative;

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(B) the schedule of benefits available under the
alternative; and

3 (C) whether, in obtaining the alternative, some 4 or all of the districts in the region should jointly seek health 5 coverage under that alternative as a group.

6 (e) Not later than November 1, 2022, each committee shall 7 submit to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, each standing committee of the senate or 8 9 house of representatives having primary jurisdiction over public education or public retirement systems, the commissioner of the 10 11 Texas Education Agency, and the executive director of the Teacher Retirement System of Texas a written report on the study conducted 12 13 by the committee under this section.

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(f) This section expires January 1, 2023.

15 SECTION 4. Sections 1579.1045 and 1579.155, Insurance Code, 16 as added by this Act, apply only to group coverage provided for a 17 plan year beginning on or after September 1, 2022. A plan year that 18 begins before that date is governed by the law as it existed 19 immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that law is 20 continued in effect for that purpose.

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SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
