4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 386.051(b), Health and Safety Code, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	(b) Under the plan, the commission and the comptroller shall
8	provide grants or other funding for:
9	(1) the diesel emissions reduction incentive program

- 9 (1) the diesel emissions reduction incentive program
 10 established under Subchapter C, including for infrastructure
 11 projects established under that subchapter;
- 12 (2) the motor vehicle purchase or lease incentive 13 program established under Subchapter D;
- 14 (3) the air quality research support program 15 established under Chapter 387;
- 16 (4) the clean school bus program established under 17 Chapter 390;
- 18 (5) the new technology implementation grant program
 19 established under Chapter 391;
- 20 (6) the regional air monitoring program established 21 under Section 386.252(a);
- 22 (7) a health effects study as provided by Section 23 386.252(a);
- 24 (8) air quality planning activities as provided by

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1 Section 386.252(d);
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- 2 (9) a contract with the Energy Systems Laboratory at
- 3 the Texas A&M Engineering Experiment Station for computation of
- 4 creditable statewide emissions reductions as provided by Section
- 5 386.252(a);
- 6 (10) the <u>Texas</u> clean fleet program established under
- 7 Chapter 392;
- 8 (11) the Texas alternative fueling facilities program
- 9 established under Chapter 393;
- 10 (12) the <u>Texas</u> natural gas vehicle grant program
- 11 established under Chapter 394;
- 12 (13) other programs the commission may develop that
- 13 lead to reduced emissions of nitrogen oxides, particulate matter,
- 14 or volatile organic compounds in a nonattainment area or affected
- 15 county;
- 16 (14) other programs the commission may develop that
- 17 support congestion mitigation to reduce mobile source ozone
- 18 precursor emissions;
- 19 (15) the seaport and rail yard areas emissions
- 20 reduction program established under Subchapter D-1;
- 21 (16) conducting research and other activities
- 22 associated with making any necessary demonstrations to the United
- 23 States Environmental Protection Agency to account for the impact of
- 24 foreign emissions or an exceptional event;
- 25 (17) studies of or pilot programs for incentives for
- 26 port authorities located in nonattainment areas or affected
- 27 counties as provided by Section 386.252(a); [and]

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- 1 (18) the governmental alternative fuel fleet grant
- 2 program established under Chapter 395; and
- 3 (19) the purchase, maintenance, upgrade, and
- 4 operation of air monitoring equipment as provided by Section
- 5 386.252(a).
- 6 SECTION 2. Sections 386.252(a) and (f), Health and Safety
- 7 Code, as effective September 1, 2021, are amended to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 (a) Money in the fund and account may be used only to
- 10 implement and administer programs established under the plan.
- 11 Subject to the reallocation of funds by the commission under
- 12 Subsection (h), money from the fund and account to be used for the
- 13 programs under Section 386.051(b) shall initially be allocated as
- 14 follows:
- 15 (1) four percent may be used for the clean school bus
- 16 program under Chapter 390;
- 17 (2) three percent may be used for the new technology
- 18 implementation grant program under Chapter 391, from which at least
- 19 \$1 million will be set aside for electricity storage projects
- 20 related to renewable energy;
- 21 (3) five percent may be used for the <u>Texas</u> clean fleet
- 22 program under Chapter 392;
- 23 (4) not more than \$3 million may be used by the
- 24 commission to fund a regional air monitoring program in commission
- 25 Regions 3 and 4 to be implemented under the commission's oversight,
- 26 including direction regarding the type, number, location, and
- 27 operation of, and data validation practices for, monitors funded by

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- 1 the program through a regional nonprofit entity located in North
- 2 Texas having representation from counties, municipalities, higher
- 3 education institutions, and private sector interests across the
- 4 area;
- 5 (5) 10 percent may be used for the Texas natural gas
- 6 vehicle grant program under Chapter 394;
- 7 (6) not more than \$6 million may be used for the Texas
- 8 alternative fueling facilities program under Chapter 393, of which
- 9 a specified amount may be used for fueling stations to provide
- 10 natural gas fuel, except that money may not be allocated for the
- 11 Texas alternative fueling facilities program for the state fiscal
- 12 year ending August 31, 2019;
- 13 (7) not more than \$1 million [\$750,000] may be used
- 14 each year to support research related to air quality as provided by
- 15 Chapter 387;
- 16 (8) not more than \$200,000 may be used for a health
- 17 effects study;
- 18 (9) at least \$6 million but not more than \$16 million
- 19 may be used by the commission for administrative costs, including
- 20 all direct and indirect costs for administering the plan, costs for
- 21 conducting outreach and education activities, and costs
- 22 attributable to the review or approval of applications for
- 23 marketable emissions reduction credits;
- 24 (10) six percent may be used by the commission for the
- 25 seaport and rail yard areas emissions reduction program established
- 26 under Subchapter D-1;
- 27 (11) five percent may be used for the light-duty motor

- 1 vehicle purchase or lease incentive program established under
- 2 Subchapter D;
- 3 (12) not more than \$216,000 may be used by the
- 4 commission to contract with the Energy Systems Laboratory at the
- 5 Texas A&M Engineering Experiment Station annually for the
- 6 development and annual computation of creditable statewide
- 7 emissions reductions obtained through wind and other renewable
- 8 energy resources for the state implementation plan;
- 9 (13) not more than \$500,000 may be used for studies of
- 10 or pilot programs for incentives for port authorities located in
- 11 nonattainment areas or affected counties to encourage cargo
- 12 movement that reduces emissions of nitrogen oxides and particulate
- 13 matter; [and]
- 14 (14) not more than \$10 million may be used by the
- 15 commission for the purchase, maintenance, upgrade, and operation of
- 16 air monitoring equipment to be used in nonattainment areas and
- 17 affected counties; and
- 18 (15) the balance is to be used by the commission for
- 19 the diesel emissions reduction incentive program under Subchapter C
- 20 as determined by the commission.
- (f) Not more than $\frac{\$5}{\$2.5}$] million from the fund and
- 22 account may be used by the commission to conduct research and other
- 23 activities associated with making any necessary demonstrations to
- 24 the United States Environmental Protection Agency to account for
- 25 the impact of foreign emissions or an exceptional event.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
