4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 84.002, Election Code, is amended by
6	amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (c), (d), (e), and
7	(f) to read as follows:
8	(a) An early voting ballot application must include:
9	(1) the applicant's name and the address at which the
10	applicant is registered to vote;
11	(1-a) a legible photograph or copy of:
12	(A) one form of photo identification listed in
13	Section 63.0101(a); or
14	(B) one form of identification listed in Section
15	63.0101(b) accompanied by a declaration of reasonable impediment as
16	<pre>described in Section 63.001(i);</pre>
17	(1-b) the last four digits of the applicant's social
18	security number or a statement that the applicant has not been
19	issued a social security number;
20	(2) for an application for a ballot to be voted by mail

to be mailed;

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on the ground of absence from the county of residence, the address

outside the applicant's county of residence to which the ballot is

(3) for an application for a ballot to be voted by mail

- 1 on the ground of age or disability, the address of the hospital,
- 2 nursing home or other long-term care facility, or retirement
- 3 center, or of a person related to the applicant within the second
- 4 degree by affinity or the third degree by consanguinity, as
- 5 determined under Chapter 573, Government Code, if the applicant is
- 6 living at that address and that address is different from the
- 7 address at which the applicant is registered to vote;
- 8 (4) for an application for a ballot to be voted by mail
- 9 on the ground of confinement in jail, the address of the jail or of a
- 10 person related to the applicant within the degree described by
- 11 Subdivision (3);
- 12 (5) for an application for a ballot to be voted by mail
- 13 on any ground, an indication of each election for which the
- 14 applicant is applying for a ballot; and
- 15 (6) an indication of the ground of eligibility for
- 16 early voting.
- 17 (c) If the requirement for identification prescribed by
- 18 Subsection (a)(1-a) is not met, the voter may be provided an
- 19 official ballot under Chapter 86 if the voter executes an affidavit
- 20 declaring the voter cannot obtain identification due to a religious
- 21 objection or an emergency. The affidavit must be in the same form as
- 22 an affidavit used for a provisional ballot under Section
- 23 <u>65.054(b)(2)(B) or (C).</u>
- 24 (d) A person is subject to prosecution for perjury under
- 25 Chapter 37, Penal Code, or Section 63.0013 for a false statement or
- 26 false information on a document executed under this section.
- (e) Section 63.0101(c) applies to documentation provided

- 1 under this section.
- 2 (f) A legible photograph or copy of solely the side of a
- 3 driver's license, election identification certificate, or personal
- 4 identification card issued to a person by the Department of Public
- 5 Safety displaying the person's photograph is sufficient to meet the
- 6 requirement for identification prescribed by Subsection
- $7 \quad (a)(1-a)(A)$.
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 84.011(a), Election Code, is amended to
- 9 read as follows:
- 10 (a) The officially prescribed application form for an early
- 11 voting ballot must include:
- 12 (1) immediately preceding the signature space the
- 13 statement: "I certify that the information given in this
- 14 application is true, and I understand that giving false information
- 15 in this application is a crime.";
- 16 (2) a statement informing the applicant of the
- 17 offenses prescribed by Sections 84.003 and 84.004;
- 18 (3) spaces for entering an applicant's voter
- 19 registration number and county election precinct of registration,
- 20 with a statement informing the applicant that failure to furnish
- 21 that information does not invalidate the application; [and]
- 22 (4) on an application for a ballot to be voted by mail:
- 23 (A) a space for an applicant applying on the
- 24 ground of absence from the county of residence to indicate the date
- 25 on or after which the applicant can receive mail at the address
- 26 outside the county;
- 27 (B) a space for indicating the fact that an

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- 1 applicant whose application is signed by a witness cannot make the
- 2 applicant's mark and a space for indicating the relationship or
- 3 lack of relationship of the witness to the applicant;
- 4 (C) a space for entering an applicant's telephone
- 5 number, with a statement informing the applicant that failure to
- 6 furnish that information does not invalidate the application;
- 7 (D) a space or box for an applicant applying on
- 8 the ground of age or disability to indicate that the address to
- 9 which the ballot is to be mailed is the address of a facility or
- 10 relative described by Section 84.002(a)(3), if applicable;
- 11 (E) a space or box for an applicant applying on
- 12 the ground of confinement in jail to indicate that the address to
- 13 which the ballot is to be mailed is the address of a relative
- 14 described by Section 84.002(a)(4), if applicable;
- 15 (F) a space for an applicant applying on the
- 16 ground of age or disability to indicate if the application is an
- 17 application under Section 86.0015;
- 18 (G) spaces for entering the signature, printed
- 19 name, and residence address of any person assisting the applicant;
- 20 (H) a statement informing the applicant of the
- 21 condition prescribed by Section 81.005; [and]
- 22 (I) a statement informing the applicant of the
- 23 requirement prescribed by Section 86.003(c); and
- 24 (J) a statement informing the applicant of the
- 25 requirement that the applicant include:
- (i) a legible photograph or copy of
- 27 identification described by Section 84.002(a)(1-a); and

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- 1 (ii) the last four digits of the applicant's
- 2 social security number or a statement that the applicant has not
- 3 been issued a social security number under Section 84.002(a)(1-b);
- 4 and
- 5 (5) any forms that may be required to meet the
- 6 <u>identification requirements of Section 84.002</u>.
- 7 SECTION 3. Section 86.001, Election Code, is amended by
- 8 adding Subsections (f) and (f-1) to read as follows:
- 9 (f) If the application does not include a legible photograph
- 10 or copy of one form of photo identification listed in Section
- 11 63.0101(a), one form of identification listed in Section 63.0101(b)
- 12 accompanied by a declaration of reasonable impediment, or an
- 13 affidavit of religious objection or emergency under Section
- 14 84.002(c), the clerk shall reject the application.
- 15 (f-1) If the applicant does not include the last four digits
- 16 of the applicant's social security number or a statement that the
- 17 applicant has not been issued a social security number, the clerk
- 18 shall reject the application.
- 19 SECTION 4. Section 86.002, Election Code, is amended by
- 20 adding Subsection (g) to read as follows:
- 21 (g) A ballot provided under this chapter must include a
- 22 space for the voter to enter the following information:
- 23 <u>(1) the voter's Texas driver's license number or the</u>
- 24 number of a personal identification card issued by the Department
- 25 of Public Safety;
- 26 (2) if the voter has not been issued a number described
- 27 by Subdivision (1), the last four digits of the voter's social

1 security number; or

- 2 (3) a statement by the voter that the voter has not
- 3 been issued a number described by Subdivision (1) or (2).
- 4 SECTION 5. Section 87.041, Election Code, is amended by
- 5 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (b-1) to read as
- 6 follows:
- 7 (b) A ballot may be accepted only if:
- 8 (1) the carrier envelope certificate is properly
- 9 executed;
- 10 (2) neither the voter's signature on the ballot
- 11 application nor the signature on the carrier envelope certificate
- 12 is determined to have been executed by a person other than the
- 13 voter, unless signed by a witness;
- 14 (3) the voter's ballot application states a legal
- 15 ground for early voting by mail;
- 16 (4) the voter is registered to vote, if registration
- 17 is required by law;
- 18 (5) the address to which the ballot was mailed to the
- 19 voter, as indicated by the application, was outside the voter's
- 20 county of residence, if the ground for early voting is absence from
- 21 the county of residence;
- 22 (6) for a voter to whom a statement of residence form
- 23 was required to be sent under Section 86.002(a), the statement of
- 24 residence is returned in the carrier envelope and indicates that
- 25 the voter satisfies the residence requirements prescribed by
- 26 Section 63.0011; [and]
- 27 (7) the address to which the ballot was mailed to the

- 1 voter is an address that is otherwise required by Sections 84.002
- 2 and 86.003; and
- 3 (8) the voter has provided the information required
- 4 under Section 86.002(g) and the board is able to verify the identity
- 5 of the voter with that information.
- 6 (b-1) Before a ballot voted by mail on which is included a
- 7 statement under Section 86.002(g)(3) may be accepted, the board
- 8 <u>shall verify that the voter did not include a driver's license</u>
- 9 number or number of a personal identification card issued by the
- 10 Department of Public Safety or the last four digits of the voter's
- 11 social security number with the voter's early voting ballot
- 12 application. If the information was provided with the voter's
- 13 early voting ballot application, the board may not accept the
- 14 ballot.
- SECTION 6. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 16 an application to vote an early voting ballot by mail submitted on
- 17 or after the effective date of this Act. An application to vote an
- 18 early voting ballot by mail submitted before the effective date of
- 19 this Act is governed by the law in effect when the application was
- 20 submitted, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 21 purpose.
- 22 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
