2	relating to the authority of all governmental bodies to hold oper
3	and closed meetings by telephone or videoconference call.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 551, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 551.0025 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 551.0025. MEETING BY TELEPHONE CONFERENCE OF
8	VIDEOCONFERENCE CALL. (a) In this section, "conference call"
9	means a meeting held by:
10	(1) telephone conference call;
11	(2) videoconference call; or
12	(3) telephone conference and videoconference call.
13	(b) Notwithstanding any other law, a governmental body may
14	hold an open or closed meeting by conference call.
15	(c) Each part of a meeting held by conference call required
16	to be open to the public shall:
17	(1) be audible to the public;
18	(2) be visible to the public if it is a videoconference
19	call; and
20	(3) have two-way communication with each participant.
21	(d) A member or employee of a governmental body may
22	participate in a meeting by conference call only if the audio signal
23	of the participant is heard live at the meeting and complies with
2/1	the provisions of this section

- 1 (e) A member of a governmental body who participates in a
- 2 meeting by conference call shall be counted as present at the
- 3 meeting for all purposes.
- 4 (f) A member of a governmental body who participates in a
- 5 meeting by conference call shall be considered absent from any
- 6 portion of the meeting during which audio communication with the
- 7 member is lost or disconnected. The governmental body may continue
- 8 the meeting only if a quorum of the body continues to participate in
- 9 the meeting.
- 10 (g) A governmental body may allow a member of the public to
- 11 testify at a meeting by conference call.
- 12 (h) A meeting held by conference call is subject to the
- 13 notice requirements applicable to other meetings in addition to the
- 14 notice requirements prescribed by this section.
- 15 <u>(i)</u> The notice of a meeting held by conference call must
- 16 provide instructions explaining how members of the public may:
- 17 (1) listen to the open portions of the meeting; and
- 18 (2) address the governmental body during the meeting.
- 19 (j) A meeting held by conference call shall be recorded.
- 20 The recording shall be made available to the public.
- 21 (k) The Department of Information Resources by rule shall
- 22 specify minimum standards for the recording of a meeting held by
- 23 conference call. The quality of the recording must meet or exceed
- 24 those standards.
- 25 SECTION 2. Section 11.1513(b), Education Code, is amended
- 26 to read as follows:
- 27 (b) The board of trustees may accept or reject the

- 1 superintendent's recommendation regarding the selection of
- 2 district personnel and shall include the board's acceptance or
- 3 rejection in the minutes of the board's meeting, as required under
- 4 Section 551.021, Government Code, in the certified agenda or tape
- 5 recording required under Section 551.103, Government Code, or in
- 6 the recording required under Section 551.0025 [551.125 or 551.127],
- 7 Government Code[, as applicable]. If the board rejects the
- 8 superintendent's recommendation, the superintendent shall make
- 9 alternative recommendations until the board accepts a
- 10 recommendation.
- 11 SECTION 3. Section 33.256, Education Code, is amended to
- 12 read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 33.256. MEETINGS. $[\frac{a}{a}]$ The council shall meet in
- 14 person at least three times each year and may hold additional
- 15 meetings by conference call if necessary.
- 16 [(b) Section 551.125, Government Code, applies to a meeting
- 17 held by conference call under this section, except that Section
- 18 551.125(b), Government Code, does not apply.
- 19 SECTION 4. Section 61.025(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 20 read as follows:
- 21 (b) Except as provided by Section 551.0025 [551.126],
- 22 Government Code, the board shall hold regular quarterly meetings in
- 23 the city of Austin, and other meetings at places and times scheduled
- 24 by it in formal sessions and called by the chairman.
- 25 SECTION 5. Section 61.06641(i), Education Code, is amended
- 26 to read as follows:
- 27 (i) The [Notwithstanding Chapter 551, Government Code, or

- 7 SECTION 6. Section 66.08(h), Education Code, is amended to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 (h) The corporation:
- 10 (1) is subject to the Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act
- 11 (Article 1396-1.01 et seq., Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes); and
- 12 (2) is subject to the provisions of Chapter 551,
- 13 Government Code (the open meetings law), that apply to the board of
- 14 regents of The University of Texas System, except that the board of
- 15 directors of the corporation[+
- 16 $\left[\frac{(A)}{A}\right]$ may discuss an investment or potential
- 17 investment with one or more employees of the corporation or with a
- 18 third party to the extent permitted to the board of trustees of the
- 19 Texas growth fund under Section 551.075, Government Code[; and
- 20 [(B) is not subject to Section 551.121 or Section
- 21 551.125, Covernment Code, rather any director of the corporation
- 22 may attend any meeting of the board of directors by telephone
- 23 conference call provided that the telephone conference is audible
- 24 to the public at the meeting location specified in the notice of the
- 25 meeting during each part of the meeting that is required to be open
- 26 to the public].
- 27 SECTION 7. Section 419.906(e), Government Code, is amended

- 1 to read as follows:
- 2 (e) Notwithstanding Section 419.0365, the commission may
- 3 temporarily suspend a person's or regulated entity's certificate on
- 4 a determination by a panel of the commission that continued
- 5 activity by the person or entity would present an immediate threat
- 6 to the public or to fire service trainees. [The panel may hold a
- 7 meeting for purposes of this subsection by teleconference call
- 8 pursuant to Section 551.125. A person or regulated entity whose
- 9 certificate is temporarily suspended under this subsection is
- 10 entitled to a hearing before the commission not later than the 14th
- 11 day after the date of the temporary suspension.
- 12 SECTION 8. The heading to Subchapter F, Chapter 551,
- 13 Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 14 SUBCHAPTER F. MEETINGS USING THE [TELEPHONE, VIDEOCONFERENCE, OR]

- SECTION 9. Sections 551.129(a) and (c), Government Code,
- 17 are amended to read as follows:
- 18 (a) A governmental body may use [a telephone conference
- 19 call, video conference call, or communications over the Internet
- 20 to conduct a public consultation with its attorney in an open
- 21 meeting of the governmental body or a private consultation with its
- 22 attorney in a closed meeting of the governmental body.
- 23 (c) Subsection (a) does not:
- 24 (1) authorize the members of a governmental body to
- 25 conduct a meeting of the governmental body [by telephone conference
- 26 call, video conference call, or communications] over the Internet;

- 3 SECTION 10. Section 116.006, Health and Safety Code, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 116.006. MEETINGS. $\left[\frac{a}{a}\right]$ The council shall meet in
- 6 person three times each year [and may hold meetings by conference
- 7 call as necessary]. The council shall invite stakeholders to
- 8 participate in at least two council meetings each year and provide
- 9 an opportunity for submission of oral or written testimony. The
- 10 council at a minimum shall invite:
- 11 (1) one individual with expertise in early childhood
- 12 nutrition and physical activity, such as a registered dietician,
- 13 physical therapist, or physical education specialist;
- 14 (2) one staff member or manager of a child-care
- 15 facility;
- 16 (3) one staff member or manager of a child-care
- 17 facility operated in a private residence;
- 18 (4) two individuals with medical experience in early
- 19 childhood health, such as a family practice physician, registered
- 20 nurse, nurse practitioner, pediatrician, or child health
- 21 consultant;
- 22 (5) one representative from a nonprofit organization
- 23 that provides family or wellness services; and
- 24 (6) one representative from an agency or organization
- 25 with expertise in community health education and outreach, such as
- 26 a local health department, public relations or marketing firm, or
- 27 university.

- 1 [(b) Section 551.125, Government Code, applies to a meeting
- 2 held by conference call under this section, except that Section
- 3 551.125(b), Government Code, does not apply.
- 4 SECTION 11. Section 117.056, Health and Safety Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 117.056. MEETINGS. $[\frac{a}{a}]$ The committee shall meet at
- 7 least quarterly or more frequently at the call of the presiding
- 8 officer.
- 9 [(b) To ensure appropriate representation from all areas of
- 10 this state, the committee may meet by videoconference or telephone
- 11 conference call. A meeting held by videoconference or telephone
- 12 conference call under this subsection must comply with the
- 13 requirements applicable to a telephone conference call under
- 14 Sections 551.125(c), (d), (e), and (f), Government Code. Sections
- 15 551.125(b) and 551.127, Covernment Code, do not apply to the
- 16 committee.
- 17 SECTION 12. Section 117.105, Health and Safety Code, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 117.105. OPEN MEETINGS ACT. The [Except as provided by
- 20 Section 117.056, the] committee is subject to Chapter 551,
- 21 Government Code.
- 22 SECTION 13. Section 120.054, Health and Safety Code, is
- 23 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 120.054. MEETINGS. $\left[\frac{a}{a}\right]$ The task force shall meet at
- 25 least quarterly each fiscal year. Members may hold meetings by
- 26 telephone conference call [calls] and through videoconference in
- 27 accordance with Section 551.0025 [551.127], Government Code.

- 1 [(b) Section 551.125, Government Code, applies to a meeting
- 2 held by conference call under this section, except that Section
- 3 551.125(b), Government Code, does not apply.
- 4 SECTION 14. Section 81.001(b), Local Government Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (b) If present, the county judge is the presiding officer of
- 7 the commissioners court. This subsection does not apply to a
- 8 meeting held under Section 551.0025 [$\frac{551.127}{}$], Government Code[$\frac{1}{7}$ if
- 9 the county judge is not located at the physical space made available
- 10 to the public for the meeting].
- 11 SECTION 15. Section 26.06(a), Tax Code, is amended to read
- 12 as follows:
- 13 (a) A public hearing required by Section 26.05 may not be
- 14 held before the fifth day after the date the notice of the public
- 15 hearing is given. The hearing must be on a weekday that is not a
- 16 public holiday. [The hearing must be held inside the boundaries of
- 17 the unit in a publicly owned building or, if a suitable publicly
- 18 owned building is not available, in a suitable building to which the
- 19 public normally has access.] At the hearing, the governing body
- 20 must afford adequate opportunity for proponents and opponents of
- 21 the tax increase to present their views.
- SECTION 16. Section 3.01(j), Article 6243a-1, Vernon's
- 23 Texas Civil Statutes, is amended to read as follows:
- 24 (j) The board has full power to make rules pertaining to the
- 25 conduct of its meetings and to the operation of the pension system
- 26 as long as its rules are not, subject to Subsections (j-1) and (j-2)
- 27 of this section, inconsistent with the terms of this article, any

   the United States to the extent applicable. A board meeting may be

   effective date of this Act. A meeting held before the effective

meeting, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 19. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
