1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to establishing reimbursement rates for certain
- 3 child-care providers participating in the subsidized child-care
- 4 program administered by the Texas Workforce Commission.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter G, Chapter 2308, Government Code, is
- 7 amended by amending Section 2308.315 and adding Section 2308.3151
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 2308.315. REIMBURSEMENT RATES FOR CHILD-CARE
- 10 PROVIDERS [CHILD CARE]. Each board shall establish and implement
- 11 graduated reimbursement rates for child-care providers
- 12 participating in the commission's subsidized child-care program
- 13 that align the commission's age groupings with the
- 14 <u>child-to-caregiver ratios and group sizes adopted by the Health and</u>
- 15 Human Services Commission. The graduated rates shall provide the
- 16 <u>highest reimbursement rate to child-care providers that provide</u>
- 17 care to children in the age group with the lowest
- 18 child-to-caregiver ratio. The commission shall supply any
- 19 demographic data needed by the board to establish the rates.
- 20 <u>Sec. 2308.3151. REIMBURSEMENT RATES FOR TEXAS RISING STAR</u>
- 21 PROGRAM PROVIDERS. (a) Each board shall establish graduated
- 22 reimbursement rates for child care based on the commission's Texas
- 23 Rising Star Program.
- 24 (b) The minimum reimbursement rate for a Texas Rising Star

- 1 Program provider must be greater than the maximum rate established
- 2 for a provider who is not a Texas Rising Star Program provider for
- 3 the same category of care. The reimbursement rate must be:
- 4 (1) at least five percent higher for a provider with a
- 5 two-star rating;
- 6 (2) at least seven percent higher for a provider with a
- 7 three-star rating; and
- 8 (3) at least nine percent higher for a provider with a
- 9 four-star rating.
- 10 (c) The Texas Rising Star Program rate differential
- 11 established in this section shall be funded with federal child-care
- 12 [child care] development funds.
- 13 (d) The commission shall examine and implement strategies
- 14 to address the increased costs a Texas Rising Star Program provider
- 15 with a four-star or three-star rating would incur to provide care to
- 16 infants and toddlers due to low child-to-caregiver ratios for
- 17 children in those age groups. [Notwithstanding Subsection (b), a
- 18 board may not reimburse a provider under the reimbursement rates
- 19 provided by Subsection (b) before the date any revisions to rules
- 20 recommended by the Texas Rising Star Program review work group
- 21 under Section 2308.321 are adopted by the commission.
- SECTION 2. Not later than December 1, 2023, each local
- 23 workforce development board shall establish the child-care
- 24 reimbursement rates required under Section 2308.315, Government
- 25 Code, as amended by this Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
