## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to inspections and examinations by the Railroad Commission
- 3 of Texas of certain sites and facilities conducted using unmanned
- 4 aircraft.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 423.002(a), Government Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (a) It is lawful to capture an image using an unmanned
- 9 aircraft in this state:
- 10 (1) for the purpose of professional or scholarly
- 11 research and development or for another academic purpose by a
- 12 person acting on behalf of an institution of higher education or a
- 13 private or independent institution of higher education, as those
- 14 terms are defined by Section 61.003, Education Code, including a
- 15 person who:
- 16 (A) is a professor, employee, or student of the
- 17 institution; or
- 18 (B) is under contract with or otherwise acting
- 19 under the direction or on behalf of the institution;
- 20 (2) in airspace designated as a test site or range
- 21 authorized by the Federal Aviation Administration for the purpose
- 22 of integrating unmanned aircraft systems into the national
- 23 airspace;
- 24 (3) as part of an operation, exercise, or mission of

- 1 any branch of the United States military;
- 2 (4) if the image is captured by a satellite for the
- 3 purposes of mapping;
- 4 (5) if the image is captured by or for an electric or
- 5 natural gas utility or a telecommunications provider:
- 6 (A) for operations and maintenance of utility or
- 7 telecommunications facilities for the purpose of maintaining
- 8 utility or telecommunications system reliability and integrity;
- 9 (B) for inspecting utility or telecommunications
- 10 facilities to determine repair, maintenance, or replacement needs
- 11 during and after construction of such facilities;
- 12 (C) for assessing vegetation growth for the
- 13 purpose of maintaining clearances on utility or telecommunications
- 14 easements; and
- 15 (D) for utility or telecommunications facility
- 16 routing and siting for the purpose of providing utility or
- 17 telecommunications service;
- 18 (6) with the consent of the individual who owns or
- 19 lawfully occupies the real property captured in the image;
- 20 (7) pursuant to a valid search or arrest warrant;
- 21 (8) if the image is captured by a law enforcement
- 22 authority or a person who is under contract with or otherwise acting
- 23 under the direction or on behalf of a law enforcement authority:
- 24 (A) in immediate pursuit of a person law
- 25 enforcement officers have reasonable suspicion or probable cause to
- 26 suspect has committed an offense, not including misdemeanors or
- 27 offenses punishable by a fine only;

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1 (B) for the purpose of documenting a crime scene
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- 2 where an offense, not including misdemeanors or offenses punishable
- 3 by a fine only, has been committed;
- 4 (C) for the purpose of investigating the scene
- 5 of:
- 6 (i) a human fatality;
- 7 (ii) a motor vehicle accident causing death
- 8 or serious bodily injury to a person; or
- 9 (iii) any motor vehicle accident on a state
- 10 highway or federal interstate or highway;
- 11 (D) in connection with the search for a missing
- 12 person;
- 13 (E) for the purpose of conducting a high-risk
- 14 tactical operation that poses a threat to human life;
- 15 (F) of private property that is generally open to
- 16 the public where the property owner consents to law enforcement
- 17 public safety responsibilities; or
- 18 (G) of real property or a person on real property
- 19 that is within 25 miles of the United States border for the sole
- 20 purpose of ensuring border security;
- 21 (9) if the image is captured by state or local law
- 22 enforcement authorities, or a person who is under contract with or
- 23 otherwise acting under the direction or on behalf of state
- 24 authorities, for the purpose of:
- 25 (A) surveying the scene of a catastrophe or other
- 26 damage to determine whether a state of emergency should be
- 27 declared;

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- 1 (B) preserving public safety, protecting
- 2 property, or surveying damage or contamination during a lawfully
- 3 declared state of emergency; or
- 4 (C) conducting routine air quality sampling and
- 5 monitoring, as provided by state or local law;
- 6 (10) at the scene of a spill, or a suspected spill, of
- 7 hazardous materials;
- 8 (11) for the purpose of fire suppression;
- 9 (12) for the purpose of rescuing a person whose life or
- 10 well-being is in imminent danger;
- 11 (13) if the image is captured by a Texas licensed real
- 12 estate broker in connection with the marketing, sale, or financing
- 13 of real property, provided that no individual is identifiable in
- 14 the image;
- 15 (14) from a height no more than eight feet above ground
- 16 level in a public place, if the image was captured without using any
- 17 electronic, mechanical, or other means to amplify the image beyond
- 18 normal human perception;
- 19 (15) of public real property or a person on that
- 20 property;
- 21 (16) if the image is captured by the owner or operator
- 22 of an oil, gas, water, or other pipeline for the purpose of
- 23 inspecting, maintaining, or repairing pipelines or other related
- 24 facilities, and is captured without the intent to conduct
- 25 surveillance on an individual or real property located in this
- 26 state;
- 27 (17) in connection with oil pipeline safety and rig

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                    (A) the image is captured by an employee of an
   insurance company or of an affiliate of the company in connection
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   with the underwriting of an insurance policy, or the rating or
   adjusting of an insurance claim, regarding real property or a
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   structure on real property; and
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                    (B) the operator of the unmanned aircraft is
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   authorized by the Federal Aviation Administration to conduct
   operations within the airspace from which the image is captured; or
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               (22) if the image is captured by the Railroad
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   Commission of Texas or an agent, servant, or employee of the
   commission in connection with the inspection and examination of:
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well, tank, or disposal or injection site;

(A) an oil or gas site or facility, including a

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- 1 (B) a pipeline facility; or
- 2 <u>(C) a surface mining site</u>.
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 88.091, Natural Resources Code, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 88.091. ACCESS TO PROPERTY AND RECORDS. The
- 6 governmental agency shall have access at all times to:
- 7 (1) the oil property of all persons for inspection and
- 8 examination, including for inspection and examination by unmanned
- 9 aircraft; and
- 10 (2) the records of all these persons for inspection,
- 11 examination, and audit.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
