A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

AN ACT

2 relating to the use of corporal punishment in public schools.

4 SECTION 1. Section 37.0011, Education Code, is amended by 5 amending Subsections (b) and (c) and adding Subsection (e) to read

6 as follows:

- 7 (b) If the board of trustees of an independent school 8 district adopts a policy under Section 37.001(a)(8) under which 9 corporal punishment is permitted as a method of student discipline, 10 a district educator may <u>not</u> use corporal punishment to discipline a 11 student unless:
- 12 <u>(1)</u> the student's parent or guardian or other person 13 having lawful control over the student has previously provided a 14 written, signed statement <u>permitting</u> [prohibiting] the use of 15 corporal punishment as a method of student discipline; and
- 16 (2) if the student receives special education services
 17 under Subchapter A, Chapter 29, the use of corporal punishment is
 18 authorized under the student's individualized education program.
- 19 (c) To <u>permit</u> [prohibit] the use of corporal punishment as a 20 method of student discipline, each school year a student's parent 21 or guardian or other person having lawful control over the student 22 must provide a separate written, signed statement to the board of 23 trustees of the school district in the manner established by the 24 board.

- 1 (e) A school district shall report through the district's
- 2 Public Education Information Management System (PEIMS):
- 3 (1) whether the board of trustees adopted a policy
- 4 under Section 37.001(a)(8) under which corporal punishment is
- 5 permitted as a method of student discipline; and
- 6 (2) a description, including the manner and
- 7 circumstances, of each use of corporal punishment as a method of
- 8 student discipline by a district educator under Subsection (b).
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2021-2022
- 10 school year.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
