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	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to the date on which a city may hold a general election.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 41, Election Code, is
5	amended by adding Section 41.0025 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 41.0025. GENERAL ELECTION FOR CITY. Notwithstanding
7	any other law, the governing body of a city shall hold a general
8	election of the city on the November uniform election date in an
9	even-numbered year.
10	SECTION 2. Section 41.005(a), Election Code, is amended to
11	read as follows:
12	(a) This section does not apply to a general election <u>of a</u>
13	city or for county officers.
14	SECTION 3. Section 41.0052, Election Code, is amended by
15	adding Subsection (a-1) and amending Subsections (c) and (d) to
16	read as follows:
17	(a-1) The governing body of a city that holds a general
18	election on a date other than the date of the general election for
19	state and county officers shall, not later than November 1, 2022,
20	hold its general election in conjunction with the general election
21	for state and county officers.
22	(c) A home-rule city may implement the change <u>required</u>
23	$\left[\frac{authorized}{authorized}\right]$ by Subsection $(a-1)$ $\left[\frac{a}{a}\right]$ or provide for the election
24	of all members of the governing body at the same election through

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1 the adoption of a resolution. The change contained in the 2 resolution supersedes a city charter provision that requires a 3 different general election date or that requires the terms of 4 members of the governing body to be staggered.

(d) The holdover of a member of a governing body of a city in
accordance with Section 17, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, so
that a term of office <u>conforms</u> [may be conformed] to a new election
date [chosen] under this section does not constitute a vacancy for
purposes of Section 11(b), Article XI, Texas Constitution.

10 SECTION 4. Section 21.005, Local Government Code, is 11 amended to read as follows:

Sec. 21.005. [CHOICE OF] UNIFORM ELECTION DATE FOR NEWLY INCORPORATED MUNICIPALITY. Not later than the first anniversary of the date of its incorporation, a newly incorporated municipality shall <u>set its</u> [select a] uniform election date <u>in accordance with</u> [<u>under</u>] Section <u>41.0025</u> [41.001], Election Code, to use for the general election of the members of the municipality's governing body.

SECTION 5. Section 22.003, Local Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 22.003. DATE OF MUNICIPAL ELECTION. An election for officers of the municipality shall be held <u>biennially</u> [annually, except as otherwise provided by law,] in each ward of the municipality <u>in accordance with Section 41.0025</u> [on an authorized uniform election date as provided by Chapter 41], Election Code.

26 SECTION 6. Section 23.023(a), Local Government Code, is 27 amended to read as follows:

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(a) After the initial election, the election for the mayor,
 aldermen, and marshal shall be held <u>biennially</u>, in accordance with
 <u>Section 41.0025</u> [annually, except as otherwise provided by law, on
 an authorized uniform election date as provided by Chapter 41],
 Election Code.

6 SECTION 7. Section 23.025, Local Government Code, is 7 amended to read as follows:

8 Sec. 23.025. INITIAL TERM OF OFFICE. The mayor, aldermen, 9 and marshal elected at the initial election under Section 23.021 10 hold office until their successors have been duly elected at the 11 following [annual] municipal election and have qualified.

SECTION 8. Section 23.026, Local Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 23.026. REGULAR TERM OF OFFICE. [(a)] The mayor, aldermen, and marshal of the municipality are elected for a term of <u>two years</u> [one year] unless a longer term is established under [Subsection (b) or under Article XI,] Section 11, <u>Article XI,</u> [of the] Texas Constitution.

19 [(b) In lieu of one-year terms of office, the governing body 20 may provide by ordinance for two-year staggered terms of office for the mayor and aldermen. If the governing body adopts the ordinance, 21 the mayor and two aldermen serve for a term of two years. The two 22 23 aldermen who serve two-year terms are determined by drawing lots at 24 the first meeting of the governing body following the annual municipal election held after the ordinance is adopted. The 25 26 remaining aldermen hold office for an initial term of one year. Thereafter, all members of the governing body serve for a term of 27

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1 two years.]

2 SECTION 9. Section 24.023(c), Local Government Code, is 3 amended to read as follows:

4 (c) The first regular election must be on an authorized5 uniform election date occurring:

6 (1) in the case of a community incorporating as a Type 7 C general-law municipality, within <u>two years</u> [one year] after the 8 expiration of the month in which the incorporation election is 9 held; or

10 (2) in the case of a municipality changing to a Type C 11 general-law municipality, within <u>two years</u> [one year] after the 12 month in which the election on the change is held.

13 SECTION 10. Sections 22.034(b) and (c), Local Government 14 Code, are repealed.

15 SECTION 11. The changes in law made by this Act apply only 16 to an election ordered on or after the effective date of this Act. 17 An election ordered before the effective date of this Act is 18 governed by the law as it existed immediately before the effective 19 date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that 20 purpose.

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SECTION 12. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
