4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 42.168, Education Code, as added by
6	Chapter 464 (S.B. 11), Acts of the 86th Legislature, Regular
7	Session, 2019, is transferred to Subchapter C, Chapter 48,
8	Education Code, redesignated as Section 48.115, Education Code, and
9	amended to read as follows:
10	Sec. $\underline{48.115}$ [42.168]. SCHOOL SAFETY ALLOTMENT. (a) From
11	funds appropriated for that purpose, the commissioner shall provide
12	to a school district an annual allotment of \$18, or a greater [in
13	$rac{ ext{the}}{ ext{l}}$ amount provided by appropriation $\underline{ ext{\emph{L}}}$ for each student in average
14	daily attendance.
15	(b) Funds allocated under this section must be used to
16	improve school safety and security, including costs associated
17	with:
18	(1) securing school facilities, including:
19	(A) improvements to school infrastructure;
20	(B) the use or installation of physical barriers;
21	and
22	(C) the purchase and maintenance of:
23	(i) security cameras or other security
24	equipment; and

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(ii) technology, including communications 1 systems or devices, that facilitates communication and information 2 sharing between students, school personnel, and first responders in 3 an emergency; 4 5 (2) providing security for the district, including: 6 (A) employing school district peace officers, 7 private security officers, and school marshals; and 8 (B) collaborating with local law enforcement agencies, such as entering into a memorandum of understanding for 9 the assignment of school resource officers to schools in the 10 district; 11 school safety and security training and planning, 12 13 including: 14 (A) active shooter and emergency response 15 training; 16 (B) prevention and treatment programs relating 17 to addressing adverse childhood experiences; and 18 (C) the identification, prevention, and management of emergencies and threats, including: 19 20 (i) providing mental health personnel and support; 21 22 (ii) providing behavioral health services;

(iii) establishing

providing programs related to suicide prevention,

threat

reporting

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and

systems; [and]

intervention, and postvention; and

- 1 (5) disaster and pandemic preparation and response,
- 2 including purchasing any item recommended for disaster or pandemic
- 3 preparation or response by the Centers for Disease Control and
- 4 Prevention or a local health authority.
- 5 (c) A school district may use funds allocated under this
- 6 section for equipment or software that is used for a school safety
- 7 and security purpose and an instructional purpose, provided that
- 8 the instructional use does not compromise the safety and security
- 9 purpose of the equipment or software.
- 10 (d) The commissioner may accept gifts, grants, and
- 11 donations from any public or private source and shall seek to obtain
- 12 <u>all available federal money to assist in providing the allotment</u>
- 13 under this section [A school district that is required to take
- 14 action under Chapter 41 to reduce its wealth per student to the
- 15 equalized wealth level is entitled to a credit, in the amount of the
- 16 allotments to which the district is to receive as provided by
- 17 appropriation, against the total amount required under Section
- 18 41.093 for the district to purchase attendance credits.
- 19 [(e) The commissioner may adopt rules to implement this
- 20 section].
- 21 SECTION 2. Section 37.108(b-1), Education Code, is amended
- 22 to read as follows:
- 23 (b-1) In a school district's safety and security audit
- 24 required under Subsection (b), the district must certify that the
- 25 district used the funds provided to the district through the school
- 26 safety allotment under Section 48.115 [42.168] only for the
- 27 purposes provided by that section.

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- 1 SECTION 3. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails
- 2 over another Act of the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021,
- 3 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted
- 4 codes.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
