- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 39.053(c), Education Code, is amended to

- 8 (ii) an indicator that accounts for the
- 9 results of assessment instruments required under Section

- 13 adopted by the agency, aggregated across grade levels by subject

- SECTION 2. Section 48.106(b)(2), Education Code, is amended 2.2
- to read as follows: 23

- 4 SECTION 3. Section 821.001(6), Government Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (6) "Employee" means a person who is employed, as
- 7 determined by the retirement system, on other than a temporary
- 8 basis by \underline{an} [a single] employer for at least one-half time at a
- 9 regular rate of pay comparable to that of other persons employed in
- 10 similar positions.
- 11 SECTION 4. Subchapter A, Chapter 822, Government Code, is
- 12 amended by adding Section 822.0012 to read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 822.0012. MEMBERSHIP ESTABLISHED THROUGH MORE THAN ONE
- 14 EMPLOYER. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this
- 15 subtitle, including Section 822.001(c), membership in the
- 16 retirement system may be established through employment with two
- 17 employers on at least a half-time basis only if the employee is
- 18 employed by each employer as an instructor for a career and
- 19 technology education course.
- 20 (b) The board of trustees shall adopt rules necessary to
- 21 <u>implement this section</u>, <u>including rules governing the</u>
- 22 apportionment of employer contributions under Subchapter E,
- 23 <u>Chapter 825.</u>
- SECTION 5. This Act applies beginning with the 2021-2022
- 25 school year.
- 26 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 27 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

- 2 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 3 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
