Sections 25.1972(a) and (b), Government Code, are amended to read as follows: 6 In addition to the jurisdiction provided by Section 7 (a) 25.0003 and other law, and except as limited by Subsection (b), a 8 9 county court at law in Reeves County has: (1) concurrent jurisdiction with the district court: 10 11 (A) in disputes ancillary to probate, eminent 12 domain, condemnation, or landlord and tenant matters relating to the adjudication and determination of land titles and trusts, 13 14 whether testamentary, inter vivos, constructive, resulting, or any other class or type of trust, regardless of the amount 15 in controversy or the remedy sought; 16 (B) over civil forfeitures, including surety 17 18 bond forfeitures without minimum or maximum limitation as to the amount in controversy or remedy sought; 19 20 (C) in all actions by or against a personal 21 representative, in all actions involving an inter vivos trust, in all actions involving a charitable trust, and in all actions 22 23 involving a testamentary trust, whether the matter is appertaining to or incident to an estate; 24

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 27

Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
