A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT relating to the protection of expressive rights of 2 student 3 organizations at public institutions of higher education. Δ BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 51.9315, Education Code, is amended by 5 6 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (g-1) to read as follows: 7 Sec. 51.9315. PROTECTED EXPRESSION ON CAMPUS. (a) In this 8 section: 9 (1) "Benefit" includes: 10 recognition by or registration with 11 (A) an 12 institution of higher education; 13 (B) the use of an institution of higher 14 education's facilities for meetings or speaking purposes; 15 (C) the use of channels of communication controlled by an institution of higher education; and 16 funding sources made generally available to 17 (D) student organizations at an institution of higher education. 18 "Expressive activities" means any speech 19 (2) or expressive conduct protected by the First Amendment to the United 20 States Constitution or by Section 8, Article I, Texas Constitution, 21 22 and includes assemblies, protests, speeches, the distribution of written material, the carrying of signs, and the circulation of 23 24 petitions. The term does not include commercial speech.

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1 (3) "Expressive rights" means the rights protected by 2 the First Amendment to the United States Constitution or by Section 8, Article I, Texas Constitution, including freedom of speech, 3 freedom of the press, freedom of association, and free exercise of 4 5 religion. 6 (4) [(3)] "Institution of higher education" has the 7 meaning assigned by Section 61.003. (5) [<del>(4)</del>] "Student organization" includes 8 any 9 organization that is composed mostly of students enrolled at an institution of higher education and that receives a benefit from 10 the institution. 11 (g-1) An institution of higher education shall permit a 12 13 student organization formed for the purpose of exercising expressive rights to establish and maintain membership and 14 leadership qualifications for the organization that further the 15 organization's purpose, including by requiring the organization's 16 17 leaders or members to: 18 (1) adhere to or comply with the organization's: (A) sincerely held beliefs; or 19 20 (B) sincere standards of conduct; or (2) be committed to furthering the organization's 21 mission or purpose. 22 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 23 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 25 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 26 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.

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
