Section 156.060, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 Sec. 156.060. CONTINUING 7 EDUCATION REGARDING THEIDENTIFICATION AND ASSISTANCE OF TRAFFICKED PERSONS [IN HUMAN 8 TRAFFICKING PREVENTION]. 9 (a) This section applies only to a physician who designates a direct patient care practice on an 10 application for renewal of a registration permit. 11 (b) A physician licensed under this subtitle who submits an 12 application for renewal of a registration permit [and who 13 14 designates a direct patient care practice] must complete at least one hour of continuing medical education approved by the board 15 16 regarding the identification and assistance of trafficked persons [, as part of the hours of continuing medical education required for 17 compliance with Section 156.051(a)(2), a human trafficking 18 prevention course approved by the executive commissioner of the 19 Health and Human Services Commission under Section 116.002]. 20 21 (c) [(b)] The hours [board shall designate the human 22 trafficking prevention course] required by Subsection (b): 23 (1) shall be designated by the board $\left[\frac{a}{a}\right]$ as $\left[\frac{a}{a}\right]$ medical ethics or professional responsibility education; and 24

17	(g) A physician may satisfy the requirement of Subsection

22	SECTION 2. Section 301.308, Occupations Code, is amended to

26 as amended by this Act, apply only to an application for renewal of 27 a registration permit to practice medicine or a license to practice

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1 nursing submitted on or after the effective date of this Act. A
2 renewal application submitted before the effective date of this Act
3 is governed by the law in effect on the date the application was
4 submitted, and the former law is continued in effect for that
5 purpose.

6 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
