A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the services provided by a colonia self-help center.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

4 SECTION 1. Sections 2306.586(a), (b), (c), and (d), 5 Government Code, are amended to read as follows:

6 (a) The purpose of a self-help center is to assist 7 individuals and families of low income and very low income to 8 finance, refinance, construct, improve, or maintain a safe, 9 suitable home <u>and otherwise improve living conditions</u> in the 10 colonias' designated service area or in another area the department 11 has determined is suitable.

(b) A self-help center shall set a goal to improve the living conditions of residents in the colonias designated under Section <u>2306.583(b)</u> [2306.583(a)(2)] within a two-year period after a contract is awarded under this subchapter.

16 (c) A self-help center may serve individuals and families of 17 low income and very low income by:

18 (1) providing assistance in obtaining loans or grants19 to build a home;

20 (2) teaching construction skills necessary to repair21 or build a home;

22 (3) providing model home plans;

(4) operating a program to rent or provide tools forhome construction and improvement for the benefit of property

1 owners in colonias who are building or repairing a residence or 2 installing necessary residential infrastructure;

3 (5) helping to obtain, construct, access, or improve 4 the service and utility infrastructure designed to service 5 residences in a colonia, including potable water, wastewater 6 disposal, drainage, streets, and utilities;

7 (6) surveying or platting residential property that an
8 individual purchased without the benefit of a legal survey, plat,
9 or record;

10 (7) providing credit and debt counseling related to 11 home purchase and finance;

12 (8) applying for grants and loans to provide housing13 and other needed community improvements;

(9) providing other services that the self-help center, with the approval of the department, determines are necessary to assist colonia residents in improving their [physical] living conditions, including help in:

18 (A) obtaining suitable alternative housing 19 outside of a colonia's area; and

20 (B) performing the following authorized public
21 service activities under Title 1 of the Housing and Community
22 Development Act of 1974 (42 U.S.C. Section 5301 et seq.):
23 (i) securing employment;

1 to enable an individual or a family to acquire fee simple title to 2 property that originally was purchased under a contract for a deed, 3 contract for sale, or other executory contract; and

4 (11) providing monthly programs to educate 5 individuals and families on their rights and responsibilities as 6 property owners.

7 (d) A self-help center may not provide grants, financing, or 8 mortgage loan services to purchase, build, rehabilitate, or finance 9 construction or improvements to a home <u>or otherwise improve living</u> 10 <u>conditions</u> in a colonia if water service and suitable wastewater 11 disposal are not available.

12 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
