1-19 relating to the services provided by a colonia self-help center. 1-20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

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1-21 SECTION 1. Sections 2306.586(a), (b), (c), and (d), Government Code, are amended to read as follows:
