Section 773.012(b), Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 7 (b) The advisory council is composed of the following 208 [19] members appointed by the governor: 9 (1) a board-certified emergency physician, appointed from a list of names recommended by a statewide professional 10 11 association of emergency physicians; 12 (2) a licensed physician who is an emergency medical services medical director, appointed from a list of names 13 recommended by a statewide professional association of emergency 14 medical services medical directors; 15 16 (3) a registered nurse, appointed from a list of names recommended by a statewide professional association of emergency 17 18 nurses; (4) a fire chief for a municipality that provides 19 emergency medical services, appointed from a list of names 20 21 recommended by a statewide fire chiefs association; 22 (5) an officer or employee of a private provider of 23 emergency medical services who is involved with the development of a Texas Trauma System, appointed from a list of names recommended by 24

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1 a statewide association of private providers of emergency medical
2 services;

3 (6) a volunteer who provides emergency medical 4 services, appointed from a list of names recommended by a statewide 5 association of volunteers;

6 (7) an educator in the field of emergency medical7 services;

8 (8) a member of an emergency medical services air 9 medical team or unit, appointed from a list of names recommended by 10 a statewide emergency medical services air medical association;

(9) a representative of a fire department that provides emergency medical services, appointed from a list of names recommended by a statewide association of firefighters;

(10) a representative of hospitals who is affiliated with a hospital that is a designated trauma facility in an urban community, appointed from a list of names recommended by a statewide association of hospitals;

(11) a representative of hospitals, who is affiliated with a hospital that is a designated trauma facility in a rural community, appointed from a list of names recommended by a statewide association of hospitals;

(12) a representative of a county provider of
 emergency medical services;

(13) one licensed physician who is a pediatrician with
 trauma or emergency care expertise;

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(14) one trauma surgeon;

27 (15) one registered nurse with trauma expertise;

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1 (16) a representative of a stand-alone emergency 2 medical services agency in a municipality or taxing district, 3 appointed from a list of names recommended by a statewide 4 association representing emergency medical services agencies;

5 (17) a certified paramedic, appointed from a list of 6 names recommended by a statewide association representing 7 emergency medical services agencies or emergency medical services 8 personnel; [and]

9 (18) <u>a representative of an ambulatory surgical</u> 10 <u>center, appointed from a list of names recommended by a statewide</u> 11 <u>association representing ambulatory surgical centers; and</u>

12 <u>(19)</u> two representatives of the general public who are 13 not qualified to serve under another subdivision of this 14 subsection.

15 SECTION 2. Not later than December 1, 2021, the governor 16 shall appoint the member of the council as required by Section 17 773.012(b)(18), Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.

18 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.

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
