A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT relating to the inclusion of an elective course on the founding 2 principles of the United States in the curriculum for public high 3 4 school students and the posting of the founding documents of the United States in public school buildings. 5 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 7 SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 11, Education Code, is 8 amended by adding Section 11.172 to read as follows: Sec. 11.172. POSTING OF FOUNDING DOCUMENTS. The board of 9 trustees of an independent school district shall permit and 10 encourage the posting in a district classroom or school building of 11 a copy of the founding documents of the United States, including the 12 13 Declaration of Independence, the United States Constitution, the Federalist Papers, and the writings of the Founding Fathers of the 14 15 United States. Section 12.104(b), Education Code, as amended by SECTION 2. 16 Chapters 262 (H.B. 1597), 464 (S.B. 11), 467 (H.B. 4170), and 943 17 (H.B. 3), Acts of the 86th Legislature, Regular Session, 2019, is 18 reenacted and amended to read as follows: 19 An open-enrollment charter school is subject to: 20 (b) (1) a provision of this title establishing a criminal 21 22 offense; 23 (2) the provisions in Chapter 554, Government Code; 24 and

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1 <u>Section 11.172</u>.

2 SECTION 3. Subchapter A, Chapter 28, Education Code, is 3 amended by adding Section 28.0111 to read as follows:

4 <u>Sec. 28.0111. FOUNDING PRINCIPLES ELECTIVE. (a) Each</u> 5 <u>school district and open-enrollment charter school that offers a</u> 6 <u>high school program shall provide an elective course on the</u> 7 <u>founding principles of the United States that meets the</u> 8 requirements for a one-half elective credit under Section 28.025.

9 (b) The course must focus on the principles underlying the 10 United States form of government, the Declaration of Independence, 11 the United States Constitution, the Federalist Papers, and the 12 writings of the Founding Fathers of the United States.

SECTION 4. Section 28.0111, Education Code, as added by this Act, applies beginning with the 2022-2023 school year.

15 SECTION 5. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails 16 over another Act of the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021, 17 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted 18 codes.

19 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
