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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the distribution of emergency health resources by the
3	state.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 161, Health and Safety Code, Subchapter
6	A is amended by adding Section 161.0110 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 161.0110. PANDEMIC VACCINE DISTRIBUTION. (a) The
8	state shall proportionally distribute to designated providers in
9	each county in the state any vaccine or immunizing agent received or
10	manufactured for the purpose of responding to a pandemic, state
11	epidemic, or public health disaster under Section 81.003, Health
12	and Safety Code, based on:
13	(1) the county population size;
14	(2) the percentage of the county population currently
15	infected compared to the state population currently infected; and
16	(3) the percentage of the county population who has
17	died as a direct or in-direct result of the disease compared to the
18	total number of people in the state who have died as a direct or
19	in-direct result of the disease.
20	(b) If the state has a limited supply of vaccines or
21	immunizing agents for distribution or has received an additional
22	supply of vaccines or immunizing agents for distribution and has
23	given priority designation to specific professions or groups of
24	people to receive the vaccine or immunizing agent, the state shall

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distribute the vaccines or immunizing agents proportionally based 1 2 on: (1) the county population size; 3 4 (2) the percentage of the county population receiving priority designation by the state compared to the total state 5 population receiving priority designation by the state; 6 7 (3) the percentage of the county population currently infected compared to the state population currently infected; and 8 9 (4) the percentage of the county population who has died as a direct or in-direct result of the disease compared to the 10 11 total number of people in the state who have died as a direct or in-direct result of the disease. 12 13 (c) Sections (a-b) only apply to counties that are located in an area with a declared disaster under Section 418.014, 418.108, 14 Government Code, as a result of a pandemic, state epidemic, or 15 public health disaster under Section 81.003, Health and Safety 16 17 Code,.

18 SECTION 2. Section 418.017, Government Code, is amended by 19 adding subsections (d-f) to read as follows:

Sec. 418.017 USE OF PUBLIC AND PRIVATE RESOURCES. (a) The governor may use all available resources of state government and of political subdivisions that are reasonably necessary to cope with a disaster.

(b) The governor may temporarily reassign resources,
 personnel, or functions of state executive departments and agencies
 or their units for the purpose of performing or facilitating
 emergency services.

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1 (c) The governor may commandeer or use any private property 2 if the governor finds it necessary to cope with a disaster, subject 3 to the compensation requirements of this chapter.

4 (d) Any personal protective equipment, sanitation equipment
5 or any other public or private resource designated for responding
6 to a pandemic, state epidemic or public health disaster under
7 Section 81.003, Health and Safety Code, must be proportionately
8 distributed to each county based on:

9 (1) the county population size;

10 (2) the percentage of the county population currently 11 infected compared to the state population currently infected; and 12 (3) the percentage of the county population who has 13 died as a direct or in-direct result of the disease compared to the 14 total number of people in the state who have died as a direct or 15 in-direct result of the disease.

16 (e) If the state has a limited supply or an additional supply of personal protective equipment, sanitation equipment or 17 18 any other public or private resource designated for responding to a pandemic, state epidemic or public health disaster under Section 19 20 81.003, Health and Safety Code, and has given priority designation to specific professions or groups of people to receive designated 21 resources, the state must proportionately distributed resources to 22 23 each county based on: 24 (1) the county population size; 25 (2) the percentage of the county population receiving

26 priority designation by the state compared to the total state 27 population receiving priority designation by the state;

1	(3) the percentage of the county population currently
2	infected compared to the state population currently infected; and
3	(4) the percentage of the county population who has
4	died as a direct or in-direct result of the disease compared to the
5	total number of people in the state who have died as a direct or
6	in-direct result of the disease.
7	(f) Sections (d-e) only apply to counties that are located
8	in an area with a declared disaster under Section 418.014, 418.108,
9	as a result of a pandemic, state epidemic, or health crisis.
10	Section 3. This act takes effect immediately if it receives
11	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
12	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

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13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
