1	AN ACT
2	relating to certain temporary vehicle permits and tags.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 502.094, Transportation Code, is amended
5	by adding Subsection (i) to read as follows:
6	(i) A permit issued under this section must be carried in
7	the vehicle, or, if the vehicle is a trailer or semitrailer, in the
8	motor vehicle pulling the trailer or semitrailer, at all times
9	during the period in which the permit is valid, including when the
10	vehicle is being operated.
11	SECTION 2. Section 502.095(f), Transportation Code, is
12	amended to read as follows:
13	(f) A registration receipt shall be carried in the vehicle
14	at all times during the period in which it is valid. The permit
15	[temporary tag] must contain all pertinent information required by
16	this section and must be attached to the vehicle in the license
17	plate display area located at the rear of the vehicle, so that the
18	entire permit is visible and legible at all times, including when
19	the vehicle is being operated. If the vehicle does not have a
20	license plate display area at the rear of the vehicle, the permit
21	[displayed in the rear window of the vehicle so that the tag is
22	clearly visible and legible when viewed from the rear of the
23	vehicle. If the vehicle does not have a rear window, the temporary
24	tag] must be attached to [on or carried in] the vehicle to allow

1 ready inspection. The registration receipt must be carried, in a
2 manner prescribed by the department, in the vehicle at all times
3 during the period in which it is valid.

4 SECTION 3. Section 502.474, Transportation Code, is amended 5 to read as follows:

6 Sec. 502.474. OPERATION OF ONE-TRIP PERMIT VEHICLE. A 7 person commits an offense if the person operates a vehicle for which 8 a one-trip permit is required without the registration receipt and 9 properly displayed permit [temporary tag].

SECTION 4. Section 503.0626(a), Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows:

12 (a) The department shall develop<u>, manage</u>, and maintain a 13 secure, real-time database of information on vehicles to which 14 dealers and converters have affixed temporary tags. [The database 15 shall be managed by the vehicle titles and registration division of 16 the department.]

SECTION 5. Section 503.0631(a), Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) The department shall develop<u>, manage</u>, and maintain a secure, real-time database of information on persons to whom temporary buyer's tags are issued that may be used by a law enforcement agency in the same manner that the agency uses vehicle registration information. [The database shall be managed by the vehicle titles and registration division of the department.]

25 SECTION 6. Subchapter C, Chapter 503, Transportation Code, 26 is amended by adding Section 503.0632 to read as follows:

27 Sec. 503.0632. MAXIMUM NUMBER OF TEMPORARY TAGS. (a) The

1	department by rule may establish the maximum number of temporary
2	tags that a dealer or converter may obtain under Section 503.062,
3	503.0625, 503.0626, 503.063, or 503.0631.
4	(b) The maximum number of temporary tags that the department
5	determines a dealer or converter may obtain under this section must
6	be based on the dealer's or converter's anticipated need for
7	temporary tags, taking into consideration:
8	(1) the dealer's or converter's:
9	(A) time in operation;
10	(B) sales data; and
11	(C) expected growth;
12	(2) expected changes in the dealer's or converter's
13	market; and
14	(3) temporary conditions that may affect sales by the
15	dealer or converter.
16	(c) At the request of a dealer or converter, the department
17	may authorize additional temporary tags of any type for the dealer
18	or converter if the dealer or converter demonstrates a need for
19	additional temporary tags resulting from business operations,
20	including anticipated need.
21	(d) The department's denial of a request under Subsection
22	(c) may be overturned if a dealer or converter shows by a
23	preponderance of the evidence the need for additional temporary
24	tags.
25	SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
