16	(b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this subchapter
17	or Subchapter F, a person described by Subsection (a) who completes
18	the person's sentence, including any term of confinement or period
19	of community supervision imposed and payment of all fines, costs,
20	and restitution imposed, may petition the court that imposed the
21	sentence for an order of nondisclosure of criminal history record

- 1 and a determination that the person is entitled to file the petition
- 2 and issuance of the order is in the best interest of justice, the
- 3 court shall issue an order prohibiting criminal justice agencies
- 4 from disclosing to the public criminal history record information

- 6 (d) A person may petition the court that imposed the
- 7 sentence for an order of nondisclosure of criminal history record
- 8 information under this section only on or after the 25th
