1-17 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
 1-18 AN ACT

1-19 relating to a Texas Medical Board complaint for a violation
 1-20 described by Section 22.011(b)(12), Penal Code.

1-21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 SECTION 1. Section 154.051, Occupations Code, is amended as
 1-23 follows by amending Subsection (d) and adding Subsection (d-1):

1-24 (d) The board may not consider or act on a complaint
 1-25 involving care provided more than seven years before the date on
 1-26 which the complaint is received by the board unless the care was
 1-27 provided to a minor or the care involves a complaint under
 1-28 Subsection (d-1). If the care was provided to a minor, the board
 1-29 may not consider or act on a complaint involving the care after the
 1-30 later of:

- 1-31 (1) the date the minor is 21 years of age; or
- 1-32 (2) the seventh anniversary of the date of the care.

1-33 (d-1) The board may not consider or act on a complaint
 1-34 involving an alleged violation of Section 22.011(b)(12), Penal
 1-35 Code, that occurred more than seven years before the date on which
 1-36 the complaint is received by the board or more than 2 years from the
 1-37 date the complainant knew or should have known of the facts giving
 1-38 rise to the complaint, whichever is later.

1-39 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply to a
 1-40 complaint under Chapter 154, Occupations Code, initiated on or
 1-41 after the effective date of this Act.

1-42 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
