- 8 productivity of the state. National studies have proven that there
- 9 are high social and educational benefits associated with

- 12 students with a more comprehensive academic curriculum, while
- 13 proactively expanding student perspectives and cultural

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- SECTION 4. For students entering a grade above ninth grade during the 2022-2023 school year, Section 28.025(b-1), Education Code, as that subsection existed before amendment by this Act, applies, and that subsection is continued in effect for that purpose.
