- 5 SECTION 1. Section 110.005(c), Civil Practice and Remedies
- 6 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 (c) An action under this section must be brought in <u>a state</u>
- 8 or federal district court.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 110.008, Civil Practice and Remedies
- 10 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 110.008. SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY WAIVED. (a) Subject to
- 12 Section 110.006 and except as provided by Subsection (b), sovereign
- 13 immunity to suit and from liability is waived and abolished in state
- 14 and federal court to the extent of liability created by Section
- 15 110.005, and a claimant may sue a government agency for damages
- 16 allowed by that section.
- 17 (b) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), this chapter does not
- 18 waive or abolish sovereign immunity to suit and from liability
- 19 under the Eleventh Amendment to the United States Constitution,
- 20 which prohibits the citizens of another state or the citizens or
- 21 subjects of a foreign state from suing this state or any arm of this
- 22 state in federal court.
- SECTION 3. Chapter 110, Civil Practice and Remedies Code,
- 24 is amended by adding Section 110.013 to read as follows:

- 1 Sec. 110.013. LAWS REGULATING OR RESTRICTING ABORTION NOT
- 2 AFFECTED. Nothing in this chapter may be construed to limit the
- 3 enforcement of any law regulating or restricting abortion or any
- 4 <u>law that withholds taxpayer funds from entities that perform or</u>
- 5 promote abortions.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
