(a) Except as provided 9 by Subsection (b), if the possessory conservator resides not more 10 than 50 miles from the primary residence of the child, the court 11 shall alter the standard possession order under Sections 153.312, 12 153.314, and 153.315 to provide that the conservator has the right 13 14 to possession of the child as if the conservator had made the elections for alternative beginning and ending possession times 15 under Sections 153.317(a)(1)(C), (2)(C), (3), (4), (5), (6), 16 (7)(C), and (8). 17 (b) A possessory conservator may decline any of the 18 alternative beginning and ending possession times under Subsection 19 (a) in a written document filed with the court or through an oral 20 statement made in open court on the record. 21 SECTION 2. The enactment of this Act does not constitute a 22
