S.B. No. 1960

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT
2 relating to the eligibility of certain children who are or were in
3 foster care for free prekindergarten programs in public schools.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 29.153(b), Education Code, is amended to
6 read as follows:

7 (b) A child is eligible for enrollment in a prekindergarten
8 class under this section if the child is at least three years of age
9 and:

10 (1) is unable to speak and comprehend the English
11 language;

12 (2) is educationally disadvantaged;

13 (3) is homeless, regardless of the residence of the
14 child, of either parent of the child, or of the child's guardian or
15 other person having lawful control of the child;

16 (4) is the child of an active duty member of the armed
17 forces of the United States, including the state military forces or
18 a reserve component of the armed forces, who is ordered to active
19 duty by proper authority;

20 (5) is the child of a member of the armed forces of the
21 United States, including the state military forces or a reserve
22 component of the armed forces, who was injured or killed while
23 serving on active duty;

24 (6) is or ever has been in:

1 (A) the conservatorship of the Department of
2 Family and Protective Services following an adversary hearing held
3 as provided by Section 262.201, Family Code; or

4 (7) is the child of a person eligible for the Star of
5 Texas Award as:

6 (A) a peace officer under Section 3106.002,
7 Government Code;

8 (B) a firefighter under Section 3106.003,
9 Government Code; or

10 (C) an emergency medical first responder under
11 Section 3106.004, Government Code; or

12 (8) is enrolled in a classroom partnership between a
13 school district and a community-based child care program and is
14 eligible for financial assistance through the state's child care
15 services program.

16 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2021-2022
17 school year.

18 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
22 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
