- SECTION 17. 1 (a) The Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission is abolished but continues in existence until September 1, 2022, for 2 3 the sole purpose of transferring obligations, property, rights, powers, and duties to the Texas Department of Licensing and 4 5 The Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation Regulation. assumes all of the obligations, property, rights, powers, and 6 duties of the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission as they exist 7 immediately before the effective date of this Act. All unexpended 8 funds appropriated to the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission are 9 10 transferred to the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation.
- 11 (b) The Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission and the Texas
 12 Department of Licensing and Regulation shall, in consultation with
 13 appropriate state entities, ensure that the transfer of the
 14 obligations, property, rights, powers, and duties of the Texas
 15 Alcoholic Beverage Commission to the Texas Department of Licensing
 16 and Regulation is completed not later than September 1, 2022.
- 17 All rules of the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission are continued in effect as rules of the Texas Department of Licensing 18 19 and Regulation until superseded by a rule of the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation. A license or permit issued by the Texas 20 Alcoholic Beverage Commission is continued in effect as provided by 21 the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act. 22 23 An application for a license or permit pending on the effective 24 date of this Act is continued without change in status after the effective date of this Act. A complaint, investigation, contested 25 26 case, or other proceeding pending on the effective date of this Act 27 is continued without change in status after the effective date of

- 1 this Act.
- 2 (d) Unless the context indicates otherwise, a reference to
- 3 the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission in a law or administrative
- 4 rule means the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation.
- 5 SECTION 18. (a) A violation of a law that is repealed by
- 6 this Act is governed by the law in effect when the violation was
- 7 committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 8 purpose.
- 9 (b) For purposes of this section, a violation was committed
- 10 before the effective date of this Act if any element of the
- 11 violation occurred before that date.
- 12 SECTION 19. This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 13 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 14 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 15 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- 16 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
