- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to adding a special purpose territory to the Port of Port
- 3 Arthur Navigation District of Jefferson County, Texas.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 197, Acts of the 58th Legislature,
- 6 Regular Session, 1963, is amended by adding Section 1A to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 Sec. 1A. (a) In this section, "special purpose area" means
- 9 the territory described by Subsection (e) of this section.
- 10 (b) Waterborne commercial cargo and vessel movements
- 11 originating in or departing from the special purpose area may be
- 12 <u>attributed as waterborne commercial cargo or vessel movements</u>
- 13 originating in or departing from the district for the purpose of
- 14 reporting to the United States Army Corps of Engineers under
- 15 applicable federal law.
- 16 (c) The inclusion in the district of the special purpose
- 17 area does not affect any powers or duties exercised in the special
- 18 purpose area by the Sabine-Neches Navigation District or the Port
- 19 of Beaumont Navigation District of Jefferson County, Texas.
- 20 (d) The district may not impose a tax in the special purpose
- 21 area.
- (e) In addition to the territory described by Section 1 of
- 23 this Act, the Port of Port Arthur Navigation District of Jefferson
- 24 County, Texas, includes the following tract as a special purpose

- 1 area:
- BEING 133.8  $\pm$  acres of land and water, part of the Neches
- 3 River in the City of Port Arthur, Jefferson County, Texas; said
- 4 133.8 ± acre tract being more fully described by metes and bounds as
- 5 follows, to wit:
- 6 BEGINNING at a point on the intersection of the thread of the
- 7 Neches River with the current city limits of the City of Port
- 8 Arthur, as described in Annexation Ordinance No. 2540, for the most
- 9 northerly comer of the herein described tract;
- THENCE, in a southeasterly direction, with the thread of the
- 11 Neches River, a distance of 7885'± to its intersection with the
- 12 current boundary of the Port of Port Arthur Navigation District on
- 13 the centerline of State Highway 87, for the most easterly comer of
- 14 the herein described tract;
- 15 THENCE, in a southwesterly direction, on the centerline of
- 16 State Highway 87, being the current boundary of the Port of Port
- 17 Arthur Navigation District, a distance of 690'± to a point on the
- 18 projected southwesterly bank of the Neches River, for the most
- 19 southerly comer of the herein described tract;
- THENCE, in a northwesterly direction, on the Southwest bank
- 21 of the Neches River, a distance of 9000'± to its intersection with
- 22 the Northwest line of City of Port Arthur Annexation Ordinance
- 23 No. 2540, same being the southeasterly line of a (Called 16.130)
- 24 acre tract of land, known as Tract Five, Parcel SE, recorded in File
- 25 No. 2020000404, Official Public Records, Jefferson County, Texas,
- 26 for the most westerly comer of the herein described tract;
- THENCE, in a northeasterly direction, on the Northwest line

- 1 of City of Port Arthur Annexation Ordinance No. 2540, a distance of
- 2  $1045'\pm$  to the POINT OF BEGINNING, and containing 133.8  $\pm$  acres of
- 3 land, more or less.
- 4 SECTION 2. (a) The legal notice of the intention to
- 5 introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this
- 6 Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a
- 7 copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies,
- 8 officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished
- 9 under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313,
- 10 Government Code.
- 11 (b) The governor, one of the required recipients, has
- 12 submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on
- 13 Environmental Quality.
- 14 (c) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed
- 15 its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, the
- 16 lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of
- 17 representatives within the required time.
- 18 (d) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this
- 19 state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect
- 20 to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled
- 21 and accomplished.
- 22 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 23 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 25 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 26 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
