A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the control of diseases of swine.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 161.041(a), Agriculture Code, is amended
5	to read as follows:
6	(a) The commission shall protect all livestock, exotic
7	livestock, domestic fowl, and exotic fowl from the following:
8	(1) tuberculosis;
9	(2) anthrax;
10	(3) glanders;
11	(4) infectious abortion;
12	(5) hemorrhagic septicemia;
13	(6) <u>classical swine fever</u> [hog cholera];
14	(7) Malta fever;
15	<pre>(8) foot-and-mouth disease;</pre>
16	(9) rabies among animals other than canines;
17	(10) bacillary white diarrhea among fowl;
18	(11) equine infectious anemia; and
19	(12) other diseases recognized as communicable by the
20	veterinary profession.
21	SECTION 2. Section 165.002, Agriculture Code, is amended to
22	read as follows:
23	Sec. 165.002. [OWNER] TREATMENT. Except as otherwise
24	provided by law, a representative of the commission or a person

- 1 <u>authorized by the commission</u> may vaccinate, inoculate, or treat
- 2 hogs [owned by that person] with classical swine fever [hog
- 3 cholera] virus or serum or with another remedy[, and a county
- 4 demonstration agent may vaccinate, inoculate, or treat any hogs in
- 5 the county in which the agent is employed with hog cholera virus or
- 6 serum or with another remedy].
- 7 SECTION 3. Section 165.003, Agriculture Code, is amended to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 165.003. SALE OR DISTRIBUTION OF UNATTENUATED
- 10 <u>CLASSICAL SWINE FEVER</u> [HOC CHOLERA] VIRUS. (a) A person may not
- 11 sell, offer for sale, barter, exchange, or give away unattenuated
- 12 classical swine fever [hog cholera] virus.
- 13 (b) This section does not prohibit:
- 14 (1) acquisition, propagation, manufacture, or use of
- 15 unattenuated <u>classical swine fever</u> [hog cholera] virus by, and on
- 16 the licensed premises of, a firm operating under a United States
- 17 veterinary license issued by the secretary of agriculture of the
- 18 United States;
- 19 (2) manufacture of unattenuated <u>classical swine fever</u>
- 20 [hog cholera] virus by a firm operating under a United States
- 21 veterinary license for the sale or distribution in states in which
- 22 use of attenuated <u>classical swine fever</u> [hog cholera] virus is
- 23 permitted; or
- 24 (3) keeping vaccine on hand for purely experimental or
- 25 research activities by a recognized college, university, school, or
- 26 laboratory engaged in research activities.
- 27 (c) In this section, "unattenuated classical swine fever

- 1 [hog cholera] virus" means a <u>classical swine fever</u> [hog cholera]
- 2 virus that has not been modified or inactivated.
- 3 SECTION 4. Section 165.021, Agriculture Code, is amended to
- 4 read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 165.021. COOPERATION WITH U.S. DEPARTMENT OF
- 6 AGRICULTURE. The commission may cooperate with the United States
- 7 Department of Agriculture in the eradication of vesicular
- 8 exanthema, foot and mouth disease of swine, classical swine fever
- 9 [hog cholera], and other diseases of swine.
- SECTION 5. Section 165.022, Agriculture Code, is amended to
- 11 read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 165.022. METHOD OF DISEASE ERADICATION. (a) Following
- 13 notice and public hearing, the commission shall adopt rules for the
- 14 enforcement of this subchapter, including rules providing for the
- 15 manner, method, and system of eradicating swine diseases.
- 16 (b) The commission may by a two-thirds vote adopt rules
- 17 under this section that are more stringent than the [may not exceed
- 18 the rules relating to] minimum standards for cooperative programs
- 19 adopted by the Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service of the
- 20 United States Department of Agriculture.
- 21 SECTION 6. The heading to Section 165.042, Agriculture
- 22 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 165.042. SALE OF UNATTENUATED CLASSICAL SWINE FEVER
- 24 [HOG CHOLERA] VIRUS.
- 25 SECTION 7. The amendments made by this Act to replace
- 26 references to "hog cholera" with "classical swine fever" are a
- 27 clarification of existing law and do not imply that existing law may

- 1 be construed as inconsistent with the law as amended by this Act.
- 2 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
