Sections 442.101, 442.102, 442.103, and 442.104 19 on March 1, 2020; 20 21 (2) the impact on substance use disorder service 22 providers since March 1, 2020, of administrative penalties assessed against providers under the provisions listed in Subdivision (1) of 23 24 this subsection;

1 (3) the economic impact on substance use disorder 2 service providers of the change in the administrative penalty 3 schedule since March 1, 2020;

4 (4) the effect of the changes described by 5 Subdivisions (1), (2), and (3) of this subsection on the ability of 6 a substance use disorder service provider to provide services in 7 this state; and

8 (5) whether the administrative penalty schedule 9 relating to substance use disorder service providers adopted after 10 March 1, 2020, is appropriate.

(d) Not later than January 1, 2022, the commission shall prepare and submit to the legislature a written report containing the results of the study and any recommendations for legislative or other action.

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(e) This section expires September 1, 2023.

16 SECTION 2. Section 464.019, Health and Safety Code, is 17 amended by adding Subsection (s) to read as follows:

18 (s) The commission shall post on the commission's Internet 19 website current administrative penalty schedules applicable to a 20 person licensed or regulated under this chapter. The commission 21 shall ensure that the administrative penalties listed in the posted 22 schedules are accurate.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
