1 AN ACT 2 relating to bullying and cyberbullying in public schools. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 3 Δ SECTION 1. Section 37.0832, Education Code, is amended by amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsection (c-1) to read as 5 6 follows: The board of trustees of each school district shall 7 8 adopt a policy, including any necessary procedures, concerning bullying that: 9 10 (1)prohibits the bullying of a student; (2) prevents and mediates bullying incidents between 11 12 students that: 13 (A) interfere with a student's educational 14 opportunities; or 15 (B) substantially disrupt the orderly operation of a classroom, school, or school-sponsored or school-related 16 17 activity; (3) [(2)] prohibits retaliation against any person, 18 including a victim, a witness, or another person, who in good faith 19 provides information concerning an incident of bullying; 20 21 (4) $[\frac{(3)}{(3)}]$ establishes a procedure for providing 22 notice of an incident of bullying to:

or before the third business day after the date the incident is

a parent or guardian of the alleged victim on

(A)

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- 1 reported; and
- 2 (B) a parent or guardian of the alleged bully
- 3 within a reasonable amount of time after the incident;
- 4 (5) $[\frac{(4)}{(4)}]$ establishes the actions a student should
- 5 take to obtain assistance and intervention in response to bullying;
- (6) $[\frac{(5)}{}]$ sets out the available counseling options
- 7 for a student who is a victim of or a witness to bullying or who
- 8 engages in bullying;
- 9 (7) $[\frac{(6)}{(6)}]$ establishes procedures for reporting an
- 10 incident of bullying, including procedures for a student to
- 11 anonymously report an incident of bullying, investigating a
- 12 reported incident of bullying, and determining whether the reported
- 13 incident of bullying occurred;
- (8) $\left[\frac{(7)}{(7)}\right]$ prohibits the imposition of a disciplinary
- 15 measure on a student who, after an investigation, is found to be a
- 16 victim of bullying, on the basis of that student's use of reasonable
- 17 self-defense in response to the bullying; [and]
- 18 (9) [(8)] requires that discipline for bullying of a
- 19 student with disabilities comply with applicable requirements
- 20 under federal law, including the Individuals with Disabilities
- 21 Education Act (20 U.S.C. Section 1400 et seq.); and
- (10) complies with the minimum standards adopted by
- 23 the agency under Subsection (c-1).
- 24 <u>(c-1)</u> The agency shall adopt minimum standards for a school
- 25 district's policy under Subsection (c). The standards must:
- 26 (1) include an emphasis on bullying prevention by
- 27 <u>focusing on school climate and building healthy relationships</u>

(2) require each district campus to establish a 2 committee to address bullying by focusing on prevention efforts and 3 4 health and wellness initiatives; 5 (3) require students at each grade level to meet periodically for instruction on building relationships 6 and 7 preventing bullying, including cyberbullying; 8 (4) include an emphasis on increasing student 9 reporting of bullying incidents to school employees by: 10 (A) increasing awareness about district 11 reporting procedures; and (B) providing for anonymous reporting of 12 13 bullying incidents; 14 (5) require districts to: 15 (A) collect information annually through student 16 surveys on bullying, including cyberbullying; and

between students and staff;

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plans to address student concerns regarding bullying, including cyberbullying; and 19 20 (6) require districts to develop a rubric or checklist to assess an incident of bullying and to determine the district's 21 22 response to the incident.

(B) use those survey results to develop action

- SECTION 2. Section 48.009, Education Code, is amended by 23 24 adding Subsection (b-4) to read as follows:
- 25 (b-4) The commissioner by rule shall require each school district and open-enrollment charter school to annually report 26

- 1 number of reported incidents of bullying that have occurred at each
- 2 campus. The commissioner's rules shall require a district or
- 3 school to specify the number of incidents of bullying that included
- 4 cyberbullying.
- 5 SECTION 3. Section 37.0832(f), Education Code, is repealed.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2021-2022
- 7 school year.
- 8 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
