A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to a matching grant program for school districts for the

3 development and implementation of programs to address the social,

4 emotional, and behavioral needs of students.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Subchapter G, Chapter 38, Education Code, is

7 amended by adding Section 38.354 to read as follows:

Sec. 38.354. MATCHING GRANT PROGRAM. (a) Subject to the 8 availability of federal or state-appropriated funds, the 9 commissioner shall establish a program under which grants are 10 awarded to school districts in an amount to match the amount of 11 12 funds pledged by the district to develop and implement programs addressing the social, emotional, and behavioral needs of students. 13 14 Funds used by a district to establish a program under this section must be funds received by the district through the school safety 15 16 allotment as provided by Section 48.115.

- 17 (b) In awarding grants under this section, the commissioner
 18 shall prioritize the award of grants to school districts located in
 19 rural areas and areas that have low property wealth per student.
- 20 (c) A program developed by a school district using a grant
 21 awarded under this section must include research-based practices
 22 and may include training, technical assistance, mentoring,
 23 coaching, and evaluation services for district personnel and
 24 program participants.

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(d) The commissioner shall adopt rules necessary to

- 3 that the instructional use does not compromise the safety and
- 4 security purpose of the equipment or software.
- 5 (e) $[\frac{d}{d}]$ A school district that is required to take action
- 6 under Chapter 49 [41] to reduce its <u>local revenue level</u> [wealth per
- 7 student] to the [equalized wealth] level established under Section
- 8 48.257 is entitled to a credit, in the amount of the allotments to
- 9 which the district is to receive as provided by appropriation,
- 10 against the total amount required under Section 49.153 [41.093] for
- 11 the district to purchase attendance credit [credits].
- 12 $\underline{\text{(f)}}$ [\(\frac{(e)}{}\)] The commissioner may adopt rules to implement
- 13 this section.
- 14 SECTION 3. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails
- 15 over another Act of the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021,
- 16 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted
- 17 codes.
- 18 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
