3	in the ERCOT power region.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 39, Utilities Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 39.159 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 39.159. ENSURING RESERVE POWER CAPACITY. (a) The
8	commission by rule shall develop a process for obtaining emergency
9	reserve power generation capacity as appropriate to prevent
10	blackout conditions caused by shortages of generated power in the
11	ERCOT power region. The rules must provide:
12	(1) parameters for estimating the amount of emergency
13	reserve power generation capacity necessary to prevent blackout
14	conditions; and
15	(2) mechanisms for equitably sharing the costs of
16	making the reserve capacity available and the costs of generated
17	power provided to prevent blackout conditions.
18	(b) In accordance with rules adopted under Subsection (a),
19	an independent organization certified under Section 39.151 for the
20	ERCOT power region shall adopt procedures and enter contracts as
21	necessary to ensure the availability of a defined amount of
22	emergency reserve power generation capacity the organization may
23	call on to prevent blackouts caused by shortages of generated
24	power.

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S.B. No. 2076 (c) Before the independent organization calls on the 1 emergency reserve power generation capacity to prevent blackout 2 conditions, the organization shall use all other sources of power 3 and demand reduction available in accordance with commission rules 4 5 adopted under this section. 6 SECTION 2. Subchapter Z, Chapter 39, Utilities Code, is 7 amended by adding Section 39.9031 to read as follows: 8 Sec. 39.9031. DISASTER BILL PAYMENT ASSISTANCE. (a) The commission shall establish a program to provide bill payment 9 10 assistance using state money appropriated for that purpose to retail customers of municipally owned utilities, electric 11 cooperatives, and retail electric providers in the ERCOT power 12 13 region. (b) The program must: 14 15 (1) provide assistance only for unusually high bills for services provided after February 13, 2021, and before February 16 19, 2021, to <u>low-income customers;</u> 17 18 (2) establish criteria for determining whether a bill 19 is unusually high; (3) allow a customer to apply for assistance to the 20 municipally owned utility, electric cooperative, or retail 21 electric provider that served the customer during the time period 22 23 in Subdivision (1); and 24 (4) require a municipally owned utility, electric cooperative, or retail electric provider that receives an 25 26 application under Subdivision (3) to: 27 (A) submit the application to the commission; and

No. 2076 1 (B) provide to the customer any assistance sent 2 by the commission to the utility, cooperative, or provider in response to the application. 3 4 (c) The commission shall consult with the counsellor to adopt appropriate criteria for designating a customer as low-income 5 6 for the purposes of this section. SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 8

9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
