5 SECTION 1. Section 141.041, Election Code, is transferred

6 to Subchapter B, Chapter 181, Election Code, redesignated as

7 Section 181.0311, Election Code, and amended to read as follows:

8 Sec. 181.0311 [141.041]. FILING FEE OR PETITION REQUIRED

9 [TO APPEAR ON BALLOT FOR GENERAL ELECTION FOR STATE AND COUNTY

10 OFFICERS]. (a) In addition to any other requirements, [to be

11 eligible] to be considered for nomination by convention [placed on

12 the ballot for the general election for state and county officers],

13 a candidate [who is nominated by convention under Chapter 181 or

14 182] must:

15 (1) pay a filing fee to the secretary of state for a

16 statewide or district office or the county judge for a county or

17 precinct office; or

18 (2) submit to the secretary of state for a statewide or

19 district office or the county judge for a county or precinct office

20 a petition in lieu of a filing fee that satisfies the requirements

21 prescribed by Subsection (e) and Section 141.062.

(b) The amount of the filing fee is the amount prescribed by

23 Section 172.024 for a candidate for nomination for the same office

24 in a general primary election.

- 1 (c) A filing fee received by the secretary of state shall be
- 2 deposited in the state treasury to the credit of the general revenue

- 4 (d) A filing fee received by the county judge shall be
- 5 deposited in the county treasury to the credit of the county general

- 7 (e) The minimum number of signatures that must appear on the
- 8 petition authorized by Subsection (a) is the number prescribed by
- 9 Section 172.025 to appear on a petition of a candidate for

- 11 (f) The secretary of state shall adopt rules as necessary to
