9	Sec. 2275.0001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
10	(1) "Interactive computer services company" means an
11	information service, system, or access software provider that
12	provides or enables computer access by multiple users to a server,
13	including a service, system, website, web application, or web
14	portal that provides a social media platform for at least 10,000
15	users to engage in expressive activity. The term does not include
16	an Internet service provider as defined by Section 324.055,
17	Business & Commerce Code.
18	(2) "State agency" has the meaning assigned by Section
19	2251.001.
20	(3) "User" means a person that posts, uploads,
21	transmits, or otherwise publishes content using an interactive
22	computer services company.
23	Sec. 2275.0002. PROVISION REQUIRED IN CONTRACT. (a) A
24	state agency may not enter into a contract with an interactive

1 computer services company unless the contract contains a written 2 verification from the company that, during the term of the contract, the company will not block, censor, remove, or otherwise 3 restrict a user's speech. 4 5 (b) An interactive computer services company may not be considered to have violated Subsection (a) based solely on the 6 7 adoption by the company of a policy to: 8 (1) restrict access to or availability of content that the interactive computer services company or user of the 9 interactive computer services company reasonably considers to be 10 obscene, lewd, lascivious, filthy, excessively violent, harassing, 11 12 or otherwise objectionable, regardless of whether that content is constitutionally protected; or 13 14 (2) enable or make available the technical means to 15 restrict access to content described by Subdivision (1). Sec. 2275.0003. ASSISTANCE FROM ATTORNEY GENERAL. On the 16 17 request of a state agency, the attorney general shall assist the agency in determining whether an interactive computer services 18 19 company has engaged in conduct that violates Section 2275.0002(a). SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 20 a contract entered into on or after the effective date of this Act. 21 A contract entered into before the effective date of this Act is 22 23 governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date 24 of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose. 25 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
