- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 245.101, Human Resources Code, is
- 6 amended as follows:

- 7 Sec. 245.101. COMPLETION OF MINIMUM LENGTH OF STAY; PANEL.
- 8 (a) After a child who is committed to the department without a
- 9 determinate sentence completes the minimum length of stay
- 10 established by the department for the child under Section
- 11 243.002, and the child does not have a pending petition for new
- 12 delinquent conduct, and is not under indictment for a felony
- 13 committed during that commitment, the department shall, in the
- 14 manner provided by this section and Section 245.102:
- 15 (1) discharge the child from the custody of the
- 16 department;
- 17 (2) release the child under supervision under Section
- 18 245.051; or
- 19 (3) extend the length of the child's stay in the
- 20 custody of the department.
- 21 (b) The board by rule shall establish a panel whose function
- 22 is to review and determine whether a child who has completed the
- 23 child's minimum length of stay should be discharged from the
- 24 custody of the department as provided by Subsection (a)(1), be

- 1 released under supervision under Section 245.051 as provided by
- 2 Subsection (a)(2), or remain in the custody of the department for an
- 3 additional period of time as provided by Subsection (a)(3).
- 4 (c) The executive director shall determine the size of the
- 5 panel described by Subsection (b) and the length of the members'
- 6 terms of service on the panel. The panel must consist of an odd
- 7 number of members and the terms of the panel's members must last for
- 8 at least two years. The executive director shall adopt policies
- 9 that ensure the transparency, consistency, and objectivity of the
- 10 panel's composition, procedures, and decisions. The executive
- 11 director shall appoint persons to serve as members of the panel. A
- 12 person appointed to the panel must be a department employee who
- 13 works at the department's central office. A member of the panel may
- 14 not be involved in any supervisory decisions concerning children in
- 15 the custody of the department.
- SECTION 2. Title 3, Chapter 53, Family Code, is amended by
- 17 adding Section 53.045 (18) to read as follows:
- 18 (18) Any degree of felony, except state jail,
- 19 committed by a juvenile while committed to the department.
- 20 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
