- 19 authority to declare a local state of disaster does not grant the
- 20 presiding officer of the governing body of a political subdivision
- 21 <u>authority to amend or suspend the qualifications for absentee</u>
- 22 voting or the procedures for conducting absentee voting unless the
- 23 law expressly provides otherwise.
